Browse all publications by **date** or by the government **institution that authored** the publication

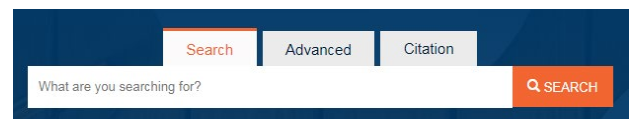
Find Publications by Searching

Basic Search – Keyword search over full text and metadata or use search and field operators to construct complex queries

Advanced Search – Over a date or date range, collection, and up to 5 fields

World Animal Day is celebrated as part of a global effort to raise awareness and improve the welfare standards of animals. In observance of World Animal Day, celebrated annually on October 4, examine animal welfare legislation and regulations on govinfo.

Animal Welfare Act

Enacted August 24, 1966, Public Law 89-544 (90 Stat. 350) is what commonly is referred to as The Animal Welfare Act although that title is not mentioned within the law. It authorizes the Secretary of Agriculture to regulate transport, sale, and handling of dogs, cats, nonhuman primates, guinea pigs, hamsters, and rabbits intended to be used in research or "for other purposes." It requires licensing and inspection of dog and cat dealers and humane handling at auction sales. (Source: [USDA](https://www.usda.gov))
