H.R. 6047, to amend title 38, United States Code, to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to increase the dollar amounts for the payment of certain disability compensation and dependency and indemnity compensation under the laws administered by the Secretary, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–577);

H.R. 785, to amend title 38, United States Code, to include a representative of the National Association of State Veterans Homes on Geriatrics and Ger-

ontology Advisory Committee of the Department of Veterans Affairs, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–578);

H.R. 41, to provide for the recognition of certain Alaska Native communities and the settlement of certain claims under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–579);

H.R. 1352, to designate the General George C. Marshall House, in the Commonwealth of Virginia, as an affiliated area of the National Park System, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119–580);

H.R. 2252, to authorize the relinquishment and in lieu selection of land and minerals in the State of North Dakota, to restore land and minerals to Indian Tribes within the State of North Dakota, and for

other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119-581);

H.R. 2768, to amend the National Trails System Act to direct the Secretary of Agriculture to conduct a study on the feasibility of designating the Benton MacKaye Trail as a national scenic trail, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119-582);

H.R. 4463, to amend the Catawba Indian Tribe of South Carolina Land Claims Settlement Act of 1993 (H. Rept. 119-583);

H.R. 4684, to direct the Secretary of Agriculture to issue a special use permit with respect to the maintaining of a flagpole bearing the flag of the United States at Kyhv Peak Lookout Point, Utah, and other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119-584); and

H.R. 5682, to take certain land in the State of California into trust for the benefit of the Pechanga Band of Indians, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 119-585). **Pages H2819-20**
