Mr. MACHTLEY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To revive, and extend until January 1, 1999, the suspension of duty on certain narrow fabric weaving machines.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF DUTY.**

4 Heading 9902.84.42 (relating to power-driven weav-
5 ing machines for weaving fabrics not exceeding 30cm in
6 width) of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United
7 States is amended by striking out “12/31/92” and insert-
8 ing “12/31/98”.

1 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by sub-
3 section (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or with-
4 drawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after the
5 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.

6 (b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION TO TERMINATION OF
7 PREVIOUS SUSPENSION.—Notwithstanding section 514 of
8 the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other pro-
9 vision of law, upon proper request filed with the appro-
10 priate customs officer before the 90th day after the date
11 of the enactment of this Act, any entry, or withdrawal
12 from warehouse for consumption, of any good described
13 in heading 9902.84.42 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule
14 of the United States that was made—

15 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

16 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
17 actment of this Act;

18 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such entry
19 or withdrawal occurred on the 15th day after the date of
20 the enactment of this Act.
