Mrs. NORTON introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Foreign Affairs and Armed Services

A BILL

To provide for nuclear disarmament and economic conversion in accordance with District of Columbia Initiative Measure Number 37 of 1993.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Nuclear Disarmament
5 and Economic Conversion Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT FOR NUCLEAR DISARMAMENT AND**
7 **ECONOMIC CONVERSION.**

8 The United States Government—

1 (1) shall disable and dismantle all its nuclear
2 weapons and refrain from replacing them at any
3 time with any weapons of mass destruction;

4 (2) shall undertake vigorous good faith efforts
5 to eliminate war, armed conflict, and all military op-
6 erations;

7 (3) shall actively promote policies to induce all
8 other countries to join in these commitments for
9 peace on earth; and

10 (4) shall redirect resources that are currently
11 being used for nuclear weapons programs to use—

12 (A) in converting all nuclear weapons in-
13 dustry employees, processes, plants, and pro-
14 grams smoothly to constructive, ecologically
15 beneficial peacetime activities during the 3
16 years following the effective date of this Act,
17 and

18 (B) in addressing human needs such as
19 housing, health care, education, agriculture,
20 and environmental restoration.

21 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

22 This Act shall take effect when the President certifies
23 to the Congress that all foreign countries possessing nu-
24 clear weapons have established legal requirements com-

1 parable to those set forth in section 2 and those require-
2 ments have taken effect.
