# H. R. 4697

To modify the boundaries of Walnut Canyon National Monument in the State of Arizona.

Ms. ENGLISH of Arizona introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

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## A BILL

To modify the boundaries of Walnut Canyon National Monument in the State of Arizona.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3        **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4        This Act may be cited as the “Walnut Canyon Na-  
5        tional Monument Boundary Modification Act of 1994”.

6        **SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.**

7        (a) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds that:

8                (1) Walnut Canyon National Monument was es-  
9        tablished for the preservation and interpretation of  
10       certain settlements and land use patterns associated

1 with the prehistoric Sinaguan culture of northern  
2 Arizona.

3 (2) Major cultural resources associated with the  
4 purposes of Walnut Canyon National Monument are  
5 near the boundary and are currently managed under  
6 multiple-use objectives of the adjacent national for-  
7 est. These concentrations of cultural resources, often  
8 referred to as “forts”, would be more effectively  
9 managed as part of the National Park System.

10 (b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to modify  
11 the boundaries of the Walnut Canyon National Monument  
12 (hereafter in this Act referred to as the “national monu-  
13 ment”) to improve management of the national monument  
14 and associated resources.

15 **SEC. 3. BOUNDARY MODIFICATION.**

16 Effective on the date of enactment of this Act, the  
17 boundaries of the national monument shall be modified as  
18 depicted on map entitled “Boundary Proposal—Walnut  
19 Canyon National Monument, Coconino County, Arizona”  
20 numbered 360/80,008, and dated June 1994. Such map  
21 shall be on file and available for public inspection in the  
22 offices of the Director of the National Park Service, De-  
23 partment of the Interior.

1 **SEC. 4. ACQUISITION AND TRANSFER OF PROPERTY.**

2       The Secretary of the Interior is authorized to acquire  
3 lands and interest in lands within the national monument,  
4 by donation, purchase with donated or appropriated funds,  
5 or exchange. Federal property within the boundaries of the  
6 national monument (as modified by this Act) is hereby  
7 transferred to the administrative jurisdiction of the Sec-  
8 retary of the Interior for management as part of the na-  
9 tional monument. Federal property excluded from the  
10 monument pursuant to the boundary modification under  
11 section 3 is hereby transferred to the administrative juris-  
12 diction of the Secretary of Agriculture to be managed as  
13 a part of the Coconino National Forest.

14 **SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION.**

15       The Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-  
16 rector of the National Park Service, shall manage the na-  
17 tional monument in accordance with this Act and the pro-  
18 visions of law generally applicable to units of the National  
19 Park Service, including “An Act to establish a National  
20 Park Service,” approved August 25, 1916 (39 Stat. 535;  
21 16 U.S.C. 1, 2–4), and for other purposes.

22 **SEC. 6. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

23       There is authorized to be appropriated such sums as  
24 may be necessary to carry out the purpose of this Act.

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
