Mr. STENHOLM introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Elizabeth M. Hill

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SATISFACTION OF CLAIM AGAINST THE UNITED**
4 **STATES.**

5 The Secretary of the Treasury shall pay, out of any
6 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to
7 Elizabeth M. Hill—

8 (1) the sum of \$6,780, and

9 (2) interest on such sum—

10 (A) calculated at the rate determined in
11 the manner provided in subsections (a) and (b)

1 of section 1961 of title 28, United States Code,
2 and

3 (B) payable for the period beginning on
4 October 5, 1985, and ending on the date on
5 which such sum is paid.

6 Such sum represents the amount that was recovered by
7 the United States under Public Law 87-693 (76 Stat.
8 593; 42 U.S.C. 2651 et seq.) in satisfaction of its claim
9 against a tortiously liable third person for the value of
10 medical care and treatment the United States furnished
11 to Elizabeth M. Hill, but would have been recovered by
12 Elizabeth M. Hill if a timely request for a waiver of such
13 claim had been submitted on her behalf.

14 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON ATTORNEY'S AND AGENT'S FEES.**

15 Not more than 10 percent of the sums appropriated
16 by section 1 shall be paid to or received by any agent or
17 attorney for services rendered in connection with the claim
18 described in such section. Any person who violates this
19 section shall be fined not more than \$1,000.
