CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Requesting the President to return the enrolled bill (H.R. 831), and providing for its reenrollment without the targeted tax benefit contained therein.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That the President of the United States is
3 requested to return to the House of Representatives the
4 enrolled bill (H.R. 831) to amend the Internal Revenue
5 Code of 1986 to permanently extend the deduction for the
6 health insurance costs of self-employed individuals, to re-
7 peal the provision permitting nonrecognition of gain on
8 sales and exchanges effectuating policies of the Federal

1 Communications Commission, and for other purposes. The
 2 Clerk of the House is authorized to receive such bill if
 3 it is returned when the House is not in session. Upon the
 4 return of such bill, the action of the Speaker of the House
 5 of Representatives and the Acting President pro tempore
 6 of the Senate in signing it shall be deemed rescinded and
 7 the Clerk of the House shall reenroll the bill with the fol-
 8 lowing corrections: In subparagraph (B) of section 2(d)(2)
 9 of the bill (relating to sales contingent on issuance of cer-
 10 tificate)—

11 (1) strike clause (ii), and

12 (2) strike

13 “(B) SALES CONTINGENT ON ISSUANCE OF
 14 CERTIFICATE.—

15 “(i) IN GENERAL.—A contract”

16 and insert

17 “(B) SALES CONTINGENT ON ISSUANCE OF
 18 CERTIFICATE.—A contract”.
