12 *cally provided for in this Act) which were conducted in the*
13 *fiscal year 1995:*

2 *account heading “Aging services programs” under the*
3 *Administration on Aging in the Department of*
4 *Health and Human Services;*

5 *All grants to States for child welfare services, au-*
6 *thorized by title IV, part B, subpart 1, of the Social*
7 *Security Act, under the account heading “Children*
8 *and families services programs” under the Adminis-*
9 *tration for Children and Families in the Department*
10 *of Health and Human Services;*

11 *All Federal Parent Locator Service activities, as*
12 *authorized by section 453 of the Social Security Act,*
13 *under the account heading “Children and families*
14 *services programs” under the Administration for*
15 *Children and Families in the Department of Health*
16 *and Human Services;*

17 *All State unemployment insurance administra-*
18 *tion activities under the account heading “State un-*
19 *employment insurance and employment service oper-*
20 *ations” under the Employment and Training Admin-*
21 *istration in the Department of Labor;*

22 *All general welfare assistance payments and fos-*
23 *ter care payments, as authorized by law, funded*
24 *under the account heading “Operation of Indian pro-*

1 *grams” under the Bureau of Indian Affairs in the*
2 *Department of the Interior;*

3 *All projects and activities funded under the ac-*
4 *count heading “Family support payments to States”*
5 *under the Administration For Children and Families*
6 *in the Department of Health and Human Services;*

7 *All projects and activities funded under the ac-*
8 *count heading “Payments to States for foster care and*
9 *adoption assistance” under the Administration For*
10 *Children and Families in the Department of Health*
11 *and Human Services;*

12 *All administrative activities necessary to carry*
13 *out the projects and activities in the preceeding two*
14 *paragraphs;*

15 *All projects and activities funded under the ac-*
16 *count headings “Dual benefits payments account”,*
17 *“Limitation on administration” and “Limitation on*
18 *railroad unemployment insurance administration*
19 *fund” under the Railroad Retirement Board;*

20 *All projects and activities necessary to accommo-*
21 *date visitors and to provide for visitor services in the*
22 *National Park System, the National Wildlife Refuges,*
23 *the National Forests, the facilities operated by the*
24 *Smithsonian Institution, the National Gallery of Art,*

1 *the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts,*
2 *and the United States Holocaust Memorial; and*

3 *All projects and activities necessary to process*
4 *visas and passports and to provide for American citi-*
5 *zen services, notwithstanding section 15 of the State*
6 *Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956: Provided,*
7 *That whenever the amount which would be made*
8 *available or the authority which would be granted*
9 *under an Act which included funding for fiscal year*
10 *1996 for the projects and activities listed in this sec-*
11 *tion is greater than that which would be available or*
12 *granted under current operations, the pertinent*
13 *project or activity shall be continued at a rate for op-*
14 *erations not exceeding the current rate.*

15 *(b) Whenever the amount which would be made avail-*
16 *able or the authority which would be granted under the Act*
17 *which included funding for fiscal year 1996 for the projects*
18 *and activities listed in this section as passed by the House*
19 *as of the date of enactment of this Act, is different from*
20 *that which would be available or granted under such Act*
21 *as passed by the Senate as of the date of enactment of this*
22 *Act, the pertinent project or activity shall be continued at*
23 *a rate for operations not exceeding the current rate or the*
24 *rate permitted by the action of the House or the Senate,*
25 *whichever is lower, under the authority and conditions pro-*

1 *vided in the applicable appropriations Act for the fiscal*
2 *year 1995.*

3 *(c) Whenever an Act which included funding for fiscal*
4 *year 1996 for the projects and activities listed in this sec-*
5 *tion has been passed by only the House or only the Senate*
6 *as of the date of enactment of this Act, the pertinent project*
7 *or activity shall be continued under the appropriation,*
8 *fund, or authority granted by the one House at a rate for*
9 *operations not exceeding the current rate or the rate per-*
10 *mitted by the action of the one House, whichever is lower,*
11 *and under the authority and conditions provided in the ap-*
12 *plicable appropriations Act for the fiscal year 1995.*

13 *SEC. 102. Appropriations made by section 101 shall*
14 *be available to the extent and in the manner which would*
15 *be provided by the pertinent appropriations Act.*

16 *SEC. 103. No appropriation or funds made available*
17 *or authority granted pursuant to section 101 shall be used*
18 *to initiate or resume any project or activity for which ap-*
19 *propriations, funds, or other authority were not available*
20 *during the fiscal year 1995.*

21 *SEC. 104. No provision which is included in the appro-*
22 *priations Act enumerated in section 101 but which was not*
23 *included in the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal*
24 *year 1995 and which by its terms is applicable to more*
25 *than one appropriation, fund, or authority shall be applica-*

1 ble to any appropriation, fund, or authority provided in
2 this Act.

3 *SEC. 105. Appropriations made and authority granted*
4 *pursuant to this title of this Act shall cover all obligations*
5 *or expenditures incurred for any program, project, or activ-*
6 *ity during the period for which funds or authority for such*
7 *project or activity are available under this Act.*

8 *SEC. 106. Unless otherwise provided for in this title*

12 *shall be construed to waive any other provision of law gov-*
13 *erning the apportionment of funds.*

14 *SEC. 110. For the purposes of this title of this Act,*
15 *the time covered by this title of this Act shall be considered*
16 *to have begun on December 16, 1995.*

17 *SEC. 111. Notwithstanding any other provision of this*
18 *Act, except section 106, funds appropriated under section*
19 *101 for the payment of vested dual benefits under the Rail-*
20 *road Retirement Act shall be made available so as to fully*
21 *fund the payments made on January 1, 1996, and the pay-*
22 *ments to be made within the period covered by this Act in-*
23 *cluding those payments to be made on the first day of each*
24 *month within the period covered by this Act. In addition*
25 *to the funds appropriated under section 101 of this Act,*

1 \$12,800,000 is appropriated to restore full funding for pay-

10 *VETERANS AFFAIRS*

11 *The following sums are hereby appropriated, out of*
 12 *any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,*
 13 *and out of applicable corporate or other revenues, receipts,*
 14 *and funds, for the several departments, agencies, corpora-*
 15 *tions, and other organizational units of Government for the*
 16 *fiscal year 1996, and for other purposes, namely:*

17 *SEC. 201. ENSURED PAYMENT DURING FISCAL YEAR*
 18 *1996 OF VETERANS' BENEFITS IN EVENT OF LACK OF AP-*
 19 *PROPRIATIONS.—(a) PAYMENTS REQUIRED.—In any case*
 20 *during fiscal year 1996 in which appropriations are not*
 21 *otherwise available for programs, projects, and activities of*
 22 *the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Secretary of Veter-*
 23 *ans Affairs shall nevertheless ensure that—*

24 *(1) payments of existing veterans benefits are*
 25 *made in accordance with regular procedures and*

1 *schedules and in accordance with eligibility require-*
2 *ments for such benefits; and*

3 *(2) payments to contractors of the Veterans*
4 *Health Administration of the Department of Veterans*
5 *Affairs are made when due in the case of services pro-*
6 *vided that directly relate to patient health and safety.*

7 *(b) FUNDING.—There is hereby appropriated such*

21 *SEC. 310. ALL FEDERAL EMPLOYEES DEEMED TO BE*
 22 *EXCEPTED EMPLOYEES.—(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1342*
 23 *of title 31, United States Code, is amended for the period*
 24 *December 15, 1995 through January 26, 1996—*

1 (1) by inserting after the first sentence “All offi-
2 cers and employees of the United States Government
3 or the District of Columbia government shall be
4 deemed to be performing services relating to emer-
5 gencies involving the safety of human life or the pro-
6 tection of property.”; and

7 (2) by striking out the last sentence.

8 SEC. 311. EXCEPTED EMPLOYEES UNDER NORMAL
9 LEAVE POLICY.—Federal employees considered excepted
10 from furlough during any period in which there is a lapse
11 in appropriations with respect to the agency activity in
12 which the employee is engaged shall not be considered to
13 be furloughed when on leave and shall be subject to the same
14 leave regulations as if no lapse in appropriations had oc-
15 curred.

16 SEC. 312. ELIGIBILITY FOR UNEMPLOYMENT COM-
17 PENSATION.—Notwithstanding any other provisions of law,
18 beginning on January 2, 1996, any Federal employee who
19 is excepted from furlough and is not being paid due to a
20 lapse in appropriations shall be deemed to be totally sepa-
21 rated from Federal service and eligible for unemployment
22 compensation benefits under subchapter I of chapter 85 of
23 title 5 of the United States Code with no waiting period
24 for such eligibility to accrue.

17 *project or activity shall be continued at a rate for oper-*
18 *ations not exceeding the current rate or the rate permitted*
19 *by the action of the House or the Senate, whichever is lower,*
20 *under the authority and conditions provided in the applica-*
21 *ble appropriations Act for the fiscal year 1995: Provided,*
22 *That where an item is not included in either version or*
23 *where an item is included in only one version of the Act*
24 *as passed by both Houses as of the date of enactment of*
25 *this Act, the pertinent project or activity shall not be con-*

1 *tinued except as provided for in section 411 or 412 under*
2 *the appropriation, fund, or authority granted by the appli-*
3 *cable appropriations Act for the fiscal year 1995 and under*
4 *the authority and conditions provided in the applicable ap-*
5 *propriations Act for the fiscal year 1995.*

6 *SEC. 402. Appropriations made by section 401 shall*
7 *be available to the extent and in the manner which would*
8 *be provided by the pertinent appropriations Act.*

9 *SEC. 403. No appropriation or funds made available*
10 *or authority granted pursuant to section 401 shall be used*
11 *to initiate or resume any project or activity for which ap-*
12 *propriations, funds, or other authority were not available*
13 *during the fiscal year 1995.*

14 *SEC. 404. No provision which is included in the appro-*
15 *priations Act enumerated in section 401 but which was not*
16 *included in the applicable appropriations Act for fiscal*
17 *year 1995 and which by its terms is applicable to more*
18 *than one appropriation, fund, or authority shall be applica-*
19 *ble to any appropriation, fund, or authority provided in*
20 *this title of this Act.*

21 *SEC. 405. Appropriations made and authority granted*
22 *pursuant to this title of this Act shall cover all obligations*
23 *or expenditures incurred for any program, project, or activ-*
24 *ity during the period for which funds or authority for such*
25 *project or activity are available under this title of this Act.*

1 *SEC. 406. Unless otherwise provided for in this title*
2 *of this Act or in the applicable appropriations Act, appro-*
3 *priations and funds made available and authority granted*
4 *pursuant to this title of this Act shall be available until*
5 *(a) enactment into law of an appropriation for any project*
6 *or activity provided for in this title of this Act, or (b) the*
7 *enactment into law of the applicable appropriations Act by*
8 *both Houses without any provision for such project or activ-*
9 *ity, or (c) September 30, 1996, whichever first occurs.*

10 *SEC. 407. Notwithstanding any other provision of this*
11 *title of this Act, except section 406, none of the funds appro-*
12 *priated under this title of this Act shall be expended for*
13 *any abortion except where the life of the mother would be*
14 *endangered if the fetus were carried to term or where the*
15 *pregnancy is the result of an act of rape or incest.*

16 *SEC. 408. Expenditures made pursuant to this title of*
17 *this Act shall be charged to the applicable appropriation,*
18 *fund, or authorization whenever a bill in which such appli-*
19 *cable appropriation, fund, or authorization is contained is*
20 *enacted into law.*

21 *SEC. 409. No provision in the appropriations Act for*
22 *the fiscal year 1996 referred to in section 401 of this title*
23 *of this Act that makes the availability of any appropriation*
24 *provided therein dependent upon the enactment of addi-*

1 *tional authorizing or other legislation shall be effective be-*
2 *fore the date set forth in section 406(c) of this Act.*

3 *SEC. 410. Appropriations and funds made available*
4 *by or authority granted pursuant to this title of this Act*
5 *may be used without regard to the time limitations for sub-*
6 *mission and approval of apportionments set forth in section*
7 *1513 of title 31, United States Code, but nothing herein*
8 *shall be construed to waive any other provision of law gov-*
9 *erning the apportionment of funds.*

10 *SEC. 411. Notwithstanding any other provision of this*
11 *title of this Act, except section 406, whenever the Act listed*
12 *in section 401 as passed by both the House and Senate as*
13 *of the date of enactment of this Act does not include funding*
14 *for an ongoing project or activity for which there is a budget*
15 *request, or whenever the rate for operations for an ongoing*
16 *project or activity provided by section 401 for which there*
17 *is a budget request would result in the project or activity*
18 *being significantly reduced, the pertinent project or activity*
19 *may be continued under the authority and conditions pro-*
20 *vided in the applicable appropriations Act for the fiscal*
21 *year 1995 by increasing the rate for operations provided*
22 *by section 401 to a rate for operations not to exceed one*
23 *that provides the minimal level that would enable existing*
24 *activities to continue. No new contracts or grants shall be*
25 *awarded in excess of an amount that bears the same ratio*

1 *to the rate for operations provided by this section as the*
2 *number of days covered by this Act bears to 366. For the*
3 *purposes of this title of this Act the minimal level means*
4 *a rate for operations that is reduced from the current rate*
5 *by 25 percent.*

6 *SEC. 412. Notwithstanding any other provision of this*
7 *title of this Act, except section 406, whenever the rate for*
8 *operations for any continuing project or activity provided*
9 *by section 401 or section 411 for which there is a budget*
10 *request would result in a furlough of Government employees,*
11 *that rate for operations may be increased to the minimum*
12 *level that would enable the furlough to be avoided. No new*
13 *contracts or grants shall be awarded in excess of an amount*
14 *that bears the same ratio to the rate for operations provided*
15 *by this section as the number of days covered by this Act*
16 *bears to 366.*

17 *SEC. 413. Notwithstanding any other provision of this*
18 *title of this Act, except sections 406, 411, and 412, for those*
19 *programs that had high initial rates of operation or com-*
20 *plete distribution of funding at the beginning of the fiscal*
21 *year in fiscal year 1995 because of distributions of funding*
22 *to States, foreign countries, grantees, or others, similar dis-*
23 *tributions of funds for fiscal year 1996 shall not be made*
24 *and no grants shall be awarded for such programs funded*

1 *by this title of this Act that would impinge on final funding*
2 *prerogatives.*

3 *SEC. 414. This title of this Act shall be implemented*
4 *so that only the most limited funding action of that per-*
5 *mitted in this title of this Act shall be taken in order to*
6 *provide for continuation of projects and activities.*

7 *SEC. 415. The provisions of section 132 of the District*
8 *of Columbia Appropriations Act, 1988, Public Law 100–*
9 *202, shall not apply for this title of this Act.*

10 *SEC. 416. Notwithstanding any other provision of this*
11 *title of this Act, except section 406, none of the funds appro-*
12 *priated under this title of this Act shall be used to imple-*
13 *ment or enforce any system or registration of unmarried,*
14 *cohabiting couples whether they are homosexual, lesbian,*
15 *heterosexual, including but not limited to registration for*
16 *the purpose of extending employment, health, or govern-*
17 *mental benefits to such couples on the same basis that such*
18 *benefits are extended to legally married couples; nor shall*
19 *any funds made available pursuant to any provision of this*
20 *title of this Act otherwise be used to implement or enforce*
21 *D.C. Act 9–188, signed by the Mayor of the District of Co-*
22 *lumbia on April 15, 1992.*

TITLE V

CLARIFICATION OF CERTAIN REIMBURSEMENTS

SEC. 501. CLARIFICATION OF REIMBURSEMENT TO STATES FOR FEDERALLY FUNDED EMPLOYEES.—(a) If a State used State funds to continue carrying out a Federal program or furloughed State employees whose compensation is advanced or reimbursed in whole or in part by the Federal Government—

(1) such furloughed employees shall be compensated at their standard rate of compensation for such period;

(2) the State shall be reimbursed for expenses that would have been paid by the Federal Government during such period had appropriations been available, including the cost of compensating such furloughed employees, together with interest thereon due under section 6503(d) of title 31, United States Code; and

(3) the State may use funds available to the State under such Federal program to reimburse such State, together with interest thereon due under section 6503(d) of title 31, United States Code.

(b) For purposes of this subsection, the term “State” shall have the meaning as such term is defined under the applicable Federal program under subsection (a).

1 (c) *The authority under this section applies with re-*
2 *spect to any period in fiscal year 1996 (not limited to peri-*
3 *ods beginning or ending after the date of the enactment of*
4 *this Act) during which there occurs a lapse in appropria-*
5 *tions with respect to any department or agency of the Fed-*
6 *eral Government which, but for such lapse in appropria-*
7 *tions, would have paid, or made reimbursement relating to,*
8 *any of the expenses referred to in subsection (a) with respect*
9 *to the program involved. Payments and reimbursements*
10 *under this authority shall be made only to the extent and*
11 *in amounts provided in advance in appropriations Acts.*
