AN ACT

Making appropriations for military construction, family housing, and base realignment and closure for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the
5 fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, for military con-
6 struction, family housing, and base realignment and clo-
7 sure functions administered by the Department of De-
8 fense, and for other purposes, namely:

MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, ARMY

(1)*(INCLUDING RESCISSIONS)*

For acquisition, construction, installation, and equipment of temporary or permanent public works, military installations, facilities, and real property for the Army as currently authorized by law, including personnel in the Army Corps of Engineers and other personal services necessary for the purposes of this appropriation, and for construction and operation of facilities in support of the functions of the Commander in Chief, **(2)**~~\$611,608,000~~ \$496,664,000, to remain available until September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That of this amount, not to exceed **(3)**~~\$50,778,000~~ \$44,034,000 shall be available for study, planning, design, architect and engineer services, as authorized by law, unless the Secretary of Defense determines that additional obligations are necessary for such purposes and notifies the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress of his determination and the reasons therefor**(4)**: *Provided further, That of the funds appropriated for "Military Construction, Army" under Public Law 102-143, \$6,245,000 is hereby rescinded.*

MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, NAVY

For acquisition, construction, installation, and equipment of temporary or permanent public works, naval installations, facilities, and real property for the Navy as

1 currently authorized by law, including personnel in the
 2 Naval Facilities Engineering Command and other per-
 3 sonal services necessary for the purposes of this appropria-
 4 tion, ~~(5)\$588,243,000~~ \$542,186,000, to remain available
 5 until September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That of this amount,
 6 not to exceed ~~(6)\$66,184,000~~ \$49,477,000 shall be avail-
 7 able for study, planning, design, architect and engineer
 8 services, as authorized by law, unless the Secretary of De-
 9 fense determines that additional obligations are necessary
 10 for such purposes and notifies the Committees on Appro-
 11 priations of both Houses of Congress of his determination
 12 and the reasons therefor.

13 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, AIR FORCE

15 For acquisition, construction, installation, and equip-
 16 ment of temporary or permanent public works, military
 17 installations, facilities, and real property for the Air Force
 18 as currently authorized by law, ~~(8)\$578,841,000~~

 20 2000: *Provided*, That of this amount, not to exceed
 21 ~~(9)\$49,021,000~~ \$23,894,000 shall be available for study,
 22 planning, design, architect and engineer services, as au-
 23 thorized by law, unless the Secretary of Defense deter-
 24 mines that additional obligations are necessary for such
 25 purposes and notifies the Committees on Appropriations

 16 September 30, 2000: *Provided, That* such amounts of this
 17 appropriation as may be determined by the Secretary of
 18 Defense may be transferred to such appropriations of the

19 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
 20 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
 21 ministration of the Army National Guard, and contribu-
 22 tions therefor, as authorized by chapter 133 of title 10,
 23 United States Code, and military construction authoriza-
 24 tion Acts, **(20)**~~\$72,537,000~~ \$93,121,000, to remain avail-
 25 able until September 30, 2000.

1 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, AIR NATIONAL GUARD

2 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
3 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
4 ministration of the Air National Guard, and contributions
5 therefor, as authorized by chapter 133 of title 10, United
6 States Code, and military construction authorization Acts,
7 ~~(21)\$118,267,000~~ \$134,422,000, to remain available until
8 September 30, 2000~~(22)~~: *Provided, That of the funds ap-*
9 *propriated for “Military Construction, Air National*
10 *Guard” under Public Law 103–110, \$6,700,000 is hereby*
11 *rescinded.*

12 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, ARMY RESERVE

13 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
14 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
15 ministration of the Army Reserve as authorized by chapter
16 133 of title 10, United States Code, and military construc-
17 tion authorization Acts, ~~(23)\$42,963,000~~ \$48,141,000, to
18 remain available until September 30, 2000.

19 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, NAVAL RESERVE

20 For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilita-
21 tion, and conversion of facilities for the training and ad-
22 ministration of the reserve components of the Navy and
23 Marine Corps as authorized by chapter 133 of title 10,
24 United States Code, and military construction authoriza-

tion Acts, ~~(24)\$19,655,000~~ \$7,920,000, to remain available until September 30, 2000.

MILITARY CONSTRUCTION, AIR FORCE RESERVE

For construction, acquisition, expansion, rehabilitation, and conversion of facilities for the training and administration of the Air Force Reserve as authorized by chapter 133 of title 10, United States Code, and military construction authorization Acts, ~~(25)\$31,502,000~~ \$32,297,000, to remain available until September 30, 2000.

NORTH ATLANTIC TREATY ORGANIZATION

SECURITY INVESTMENT PROGRAM

For the United States share of the cost of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization Security Investment Program for the acquisition and construction of military facilities and installations (including international military headquarters) and for related expenses for the collective defense of the North Atlantic Treaty Area as authorized in military construction authorization Acts and section 2806 of title 10, United States Code, \$161,000,000, to remain available until expended.

FAMILY HOUSING, ARMY

For expenses of family housing for the Army for construction, including acquisition, replacement, addition, expansion, extension and alteration and for operation and

1 maintenance, including debt payment, leasing, minor con-
 2 struction, principal and interest charges, and insurance
 3 premiums, as authorized by law, as follows: for Construc-

9 FAMILY HOUSING, NAVY AND MARINE CORPS

10 For expenses of family housing for the Navy and Ma-
 11 rine Corps for construction, including acquisition, replace-
 12 ment, addition, expansion, extension and alteration and
 13 for operation and maintenance, including debt payment,
 14 leasing, minor construction, principal and interest
 15 charges, and insurance premiums, as authorized by law,
 16 as follows: for Construction, ~~(29)\$531,289,000~~
 17 \$504,467,000, to remain available until September 30,
 18 2000; for Operation and maintenance, and for debt pay-
 19 ment, ~~(30)\$1,048,329,000~~ \$1,051,929,000; in all
 20 ~~(31)\$1,579,618,000~~ \$1,556,396,000.

21 FAMILY HOUSING, AIR FORCE

22 For expenses of family housing for the Air Force for
 23 construction, including acquisition, replacement, addition,
 24 expansion, extension and alteration and for operation and
 25 maintenance, including debt payment, leasing, minor con-

struction, principal and interest charges, and insurance
 premiums, as authorized by law, as follows: for Construc-
 tion, ~~(32)\$294,503,000~~ \$261,137,000, to remain available
 until September 30, 2000; for Operation and maintenance,
 and for debt payment, ~~(33)\$863,213,000~~ \$850,059,000;
 in all ~~(34)\$1,150,730,000~~ \$1,111,196,000.

FAMILY HOUSING, DEFENSE-WIDE

For expenses of family housing for the activities and
 agencies of the Department of Defense (other than the
 military departments) for construction, including acquisi-
 tion, replacement, addition, expansion, extension, and al-
 teration, and for operation and maintenance, leasing, and
 minor construction, as authorized by law, as follows: for
 Construction, \$3,772,000, to remain available for obliga-
 tion until September 30, 2000; for Operation and mainte-
 nance, ~~(35)\$30,467,000~~ \$42,367,000; in all
~~(36)\$34,239,000~~ \$46,139,000.

DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE FAMILY HOUSING

IMPROVEMENT FUND

(INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

For the Department of Defense Family Housing Im-
 provement Fund, \$22,000,000, to remain available until
~~(37)expended~~ September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That, sub-
 ject to thirty days prior notification to the Committees on
 Appropriations, such additional amounts as may be deter-

1 mined by the Secretary of Defense may be transferred to
2 this Fund from amounts appropriated in this Act for Con-
3 struction in “Family Housing” accounts, to be merged
4 with and to be available for the same purposes and for
5 the same period of time as amounts appropriated directly
6 to that Fund: *Provided further*, That appropriations made
7 available to the Fund in this Act shall be available to cover
8 the costs, as defined in section 502(5) of the Congres-
9 sional Budget Act of 1974, of direct loans or loan guaran-
10 tees issued by the Department of Defense pursuant to the
11 provisions of, and amendments made by, the National De-
12 fense Authorization Act for fiscal year 1996 pertaining to
13 alternative means of acquiring and improving military
14 family housing and supporting facilities.

15 HOMEOWNERS ASSISTANCE FUND, DEFENSE

16 For use in the Homeowners Assistance Fund estab-
17 lished by section 1013(d) of the Demonstration Cities and
18 Metropolitan Development Act of 1966, as amended (42
19 U.S.C. 3374), \$75,586,000, to remain available until
20 expended.

21 BASE REALIGNMENT AND CLOSURE ACCOUNT,

22 PART II

23 For deposit into the Department of Defense Base
24 Closure Account 1990 established by section 2906(a)(1)
25 of the Department of Defense Authorization Act, 1991

1 (Public Law 101–510), \$964,843,000, to remain available
2 until expended: *Provided*, That not more than
3 ~~(38)\$224,800,000~~ \$325,800,000 of the funds appro-
4 priated herein shall be available solely for environmental
5 restoration.

6 BASE REALIGNMENT AND CLOSURE ACCOUNT,

7 PART III

8 For deposit into the Department of Defense Base
9 Closure Account 1990 established by section 2906(a)(1)
10 of the Department of Defense Authorization Act, 1991
11 (Public Law 101–510), \$2,148,480,000, to remain avail-
12 able until expended: *Provided*, That not more than
13 ~~(39)\$232,300,000~~ \$236,700,000 of the funds appro-
14 priated herein shall be available solely for environmental
15 restoration.

16 BASE REALIGNMENT AND CLOSURE ACCOUNT,

17 PART IV

18 For deposit into the Department of Defense Base
19 Closure Account 1990 established by section 2906(a)(1)
20 of the Department of Defense Authorization Act, 1991
21 (Public Law 101–510), \$784,569,000, to remain available
22 until expended: *Provided*, That such funds will be available
23 for construction only to the extent detailed budget jus-
24 tification is transmitted to the Committees on Appropria-

1 tions: *Provided further*, That such funds are available sole-
2 ly for the approved 1995 base realignments and closures.

3 GENERAL PROVISIONS

4 SEC. 101. None of the funds appropriated in Military
5 Construction Appropriations Acts shall be expended for
6 payments under a cost-plus-a-fixed-fee contract for work,
7 where cost estimates exceed \$25,000, to be performed
8 within the United States, except Alaska, without the spe-
9 cific approval in writing of the Secretary of Defense set-
10 ting forth the reasons therefor: *Provided*, That the fore-
11 going shall not apply in the case of contracts for environ-
12 mental restoration at an installation that is being closed
13 or realigned where payments are made from a Base Re-
14 alignment and Closure Account.

15 SEC. 102. Funds appropriated to the Department of
16 Defense for construction shall be available for hire of pas-
17 senger motor vehicles.

18 SEC. 103. Funds appropriated to the Department of
19 Defense for construction may be used for advances to the
20 Federal Highway Administration, Department of Trans-
21 portation, for the construction of access roads as author-
22 ized by section 210 of title 23, United States Code, when
23 projects authorized therein are certified as important to
24 the national defense by the Secretary of Defense.

1 SEC. 104. None of the funds appropriated in this Act
2 may be used to begin construction of new bases inside the
3 continental United States for which specific appropria-
4 tions have not been made.

5 SEC. 105. No part of the funds provided in Military
6 Construction Appropriations Acts shall be used for pur-
7 chase of land or land easements in excess of 100 per cen-
8 tum of the value as determined by the Army Corps of En-
9 gineers or the Naval Facilities Engineering Command, ex-
10 cept (a) where there is a determination of value by a Fed-
11 eral court, or (b) purchases negotiated by the Attorney
12 General or his designee, or (c) where the estimated value
13 is less than \$25,000, or (d) as otherwise determined by
14 the Secretary of Defense to be in the public interest.

15 SEC. 106. None of the funds appropriated in Military
16 Construction Appropriations Acts shall be used to (1) ac-
17 quire land, (2) provide for site preparation, or (3) install
18 utilities for any family housing, except housing for which
19 funds have been made available in annual Military Con-
20 struction Appropriations Acts.

21 SEC. 107. None of the funds appropriated in Military
22 Construction Appropriations Acts for minor construction
23 may be used to transfer or relocate any activity from one
24 base or installation to another, without prior notification
25 to the Committees on Appropriations.

1 SEC. 108. No part of the funds appropriated in Mili-
2 tary Construction Appropriations Acts may be used for
3 the procurement of steel for any construction project or
4 activity for which American steel producers, fabricators,
5 and manufacturers have been denied the opportunity to
6 compete for such steel procurement.

7 SEC. 109. None of the funds available to the Depart-
8 ment of Defense for military construction or family hous-
9 ing during the current fiscal year may be used to pay real
10 property taxes in any foreign nation.

11 SEC. 110. None of the funds appropriated in Military
12 Construction Appropriations Acts may be used to initiate
13 a new installation overseas without prior notification to
14 the Committees on Appropriations.

15 SEC. 111. None of the funds appropriated in Military
16 Construction Appropriations Acts may be obligated for ar-
17 chitect and engineer contracts estimated by the Govern-
18 ment to exceed \$500,000 for projects to be accomplished
19 in Japan, in any NATO member country, or in
20 ~~(40)~~*countries bordering* the Arabian Gulf, unless such
21 contracts are awarded to United States firms or United
22 States firms in joint venture with host nation firms.

23 SEC. 112. None of the funds appropriated in Military
24 Construction Appropriations Acts for military construc-
25 tion in the United States territories and possessions in the

1 Pacific and on Kwajalein Atoll, or in ~~(41)~~*countries border-*
2 *ing* the Arabian Gulf, may be used to award any contract
3 estimated by the Government to exceed \$1,000,000 to a
4 foreign contractor: *Provided*, That this section shall not
5 be applicable to contract awards for which the lowest re-
6 sponsive and responsible bid of a United States contractor
7 exceeds the lowest responsive and responsible bid of a for-
8 eign contractor by greater than 20 per centum.

9 SEC. 113. The Secretary of Defense is to inform the
10 appropriate Committees of Congress, including the Com-
11 mittees on Appropriations, of the plans and scope of any
12 proposed military exercise involving United States person-
13 nel thirty days prior to its occurring, if amounts expended
14 for construction, either temporary or permanent, are an-
15 ticipated to exceed \$100,000.

16 SEC. 114. Not more than 20 per centum of the appro-
17 priations in Military Construction Appropriations Acts
18 which are limited for obligation during the current fiscal
19 year shall be obligated during the last two months of the
20 fiscal year.

21 (TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

22 SEC. 115. Funds appropriated to the Department of
23 Defense for construction in prior years shall be available
24 for construction authorized for each such military depart-
25 ment by the authorizations enacted into law during the
26 current session of Congress.

19 (TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

SEC. 118. During the five-year period after appro-
priations available to the Department of Defense for mili-
tary construction and family housing operation and main-
tenance and construction have expired for obligation, upon
a determination that such appropriations will not be nec-
essary for the liquidation of obligations or for making au-
thorized adjustments to such appropriations for obliga-

1 tions incurred during the period of availability of such ap-
2 propriations, unobligated balances of such appropriations
3 may be transferred into the appropriation “Foreign Cur-
4 rency Fluctuations, Construction, Defense” to be merged
5 with and to be available for the same time period and for
6 the same purposes as the appropriation to which trans-
7 ferred.

8 SEC. 119. The Secretary of Defense is to provide the
9 Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and the
10 House of Representatives with an annual report by Feb-
11 ruary 15, containing details of the specific actions pro-
12 posed to be taken by the Department of Defense during
13 the current fiscal year to encourage other member nations
14 of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, Japan, Korea,
15 and United States allies (42) ~~in~~ *bordering* the Arabian
16 Gulf to assume a greater share of the common defense
17 burden of such nations and the United States.

18 (TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

19 SEC. 120. During the current fiscal year, in addition
20 to any other transfer authority available to the Depart-
21 ment of Defense, proceeds deposited to the Department
22 of Defense Base Closure Account established by section
23 207(a)(1) of the Defense Authorization Amendments and
24 Base Closure and Realignment Act (Public Law 100–526)
25 pursuant to section 207(a)(2)(C) of such Act, may be
26 transferred to the account established by section

1 2906(a)(1) of the Department of Defense Authorization
 2 Act, 1991, to be merged with, and to be available for the
 3 same purposes and the same time period as that account.

4 ~~(43)SEC. 121. No funds appropriated pursuant to~~
 5 ~~this Act may be expended by an entity unless the entity~~
 6 ~~agrees that in expending the assistance the entity will~~
 7 ~~comply with sections 2 through 4 of the Act of March 3,~~
 8 ~~1933 (41 U.S.C. 10a–10c, popularly known as the “Buy~~
 9 ~~American Act”).~~

10 ~~(44)SEC. 122. (a) In the case of any equipment or~~
 11 ~~products that may be authorized to be purchased with fi-~~
 12 ~~nancial assistance provided under this Act, it is the sense~~
 13 ~~of the Congress that entities receiving such assistance~~
 14 ~~should, in expending the assistance, purchase only Amer-~~
 15 ~~ican-made equipment and products.~~

16 ~~(b) In providing financial assistance under this Act,~~
 17 ~~the Secretary of the Treasury shall provide to each recipi-~~
 18 ~~ent of the assistance a notice describing the statement~~

20 ~~(45)(TRANSFER OF FUNDS)~~

21 ~~(46)SEC. 123. During the current fiscal year, in ad-~~
 22 ~~dition to any other transfer authority available to the De-~~
 23 ~~partment of Defense, amounts may be transferred among~~
 24 ~~the Fund established by section 1013(d) of the Dem-~~
 25 ~~onstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act of~~

1 1966 (42 U.S.C. 3374); the account established by section
2 2906(a)(1) of the Department of Defense Authorization
3 Act, 1991; and appropriations available to the Department
4 of Defense for the Homeowners Assistance Program of the
5 Department of Defense. Any amounts so transferred shall
6 be merged with and be available for the same purposes
7 and for the same time period as the fund, account, or ap-

9 **(47)SEC. 124.** The Army shall use George Air Force
10 Base as the interim airhead for the National Training
11 Center at Fort Irwin until Barstow-Daggett reaches Ini-
12 tial Operational Capability as the permanent airhead.

13 **(48)SEC. 125.** (a) In order to ensure the continued
14 protection and enhancement of the open spaces of Fort
15 Sheridan, the Secretary of the Army shall convey to the
16 Lake County Forest Preserve District, Illinois (in this sec-
17 tion referred to as the “District”), all right, title, and in-
18 terest of the United States to a parcel of surplus real prop-
19 erty at Fort Sheridan consisting of approximately 290
20 acres located north of the southerly boundary line of the
21 historic district at the post, including improvements there-
22 on.

23 (b) As consideration for the conveyance by the Sec-
24 retary of the Army of the parcel of real property under
25 subsection (a), the District shall provide maintenance and

1 care to the remaining Fort Sheridan cemetery, pursuant
2 to an agreement to be entered into between the District
3 and the Secretary.

4 (c) The Secretary of the Army is also authorized to
5 convey the remaining surplus property at former Fort
6 Sheridan to the Fort Sheridan Joint Planning Committee,
7 or its successor, for an amount no less than the fair mar-
8 ket value (as determined by the Secretary of the Army)
9 of the property to be conveyed.

10 (d) DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY.—The exact acreage
11 and legal description of the real property (including im-
12 provements thereon) to be conveyed under subsections (a)
13 and (c) shall be determined by surveys satisfactory to the
14 Secretary. The cost of such surveys shall be borne by the
15 Lake County Forest Preserve District, and the Fort Sheri-
16 dan Joint Planning Committee, respectively.

17 (e) ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The
18 Secretary may require such additional terms and condi-
19 tions in connection with the conveyance under this section
20 as the Secretary considers appropriate to protect the inter-
21 ests of the United States.

22 *SEC. 125. None of the funds appropriated in this Act*
23 *may be transferred to or obligated from the Pentagon Res-*
24 *ervation Facility Renovation (Phase I), unless the Sec-*
25 *retary of Defense certifies that the total cost for the plan-*

1 ning design, construction and installation of equipment for
2 the renovation of the Pentagon Reservation will not exceed
3 \$1,218,000,000.

4 **(49)**SEC. 126. In addition to amounts appropriated
5 elsewhere in this Act, \$228,098,000 is hereby appropriated,
6 to remain available until September 30, 2000, to the follow-
7 ing accounts in the amounts specified:

9 \$20,000,000;

10 Military Construction, Navy, 1996/2000,
