Ms. ENID GREENE of Utah, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2391) to amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to provide compensatory time for all employees.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2391) to amend the Fair Labor
6 Standards Act of 1938 to provide compensatory time for
7 all employees. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-

1 pensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill
2 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
3 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
4 the Committee on Economic and Educational Opportuni-
5 ties. After general debate the bill shall be considered for
6 amendment under the five-minute rule for a period not
7 to exceed two hours. It shall be in order to consider as
8 an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the
9 five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
10 stitute recommended by the Committee on Economic and
11 Educational Opportunities now printed in the bill. The
12 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall
13 be considered as read. Points of order against the commit-
14 tee amendment in the nature of a substitute for failure
15 to comply with clause 7 of rule XVI are waived. Before
16 consideration of any other amendment it shall be in order
17 to consider the amendment printed in the report of the
18 Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution, if of-
19 fered by Representative Goodling of Pennsylvania or his
20 designee. That amendment shall be considered as read,
21 may amend portions of the bill not yet read, shall be de-
22 batable for ten minutes equally divided and controlled by
23 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to
24 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-
25 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee

1 of the Whole. If that amendment is adopted, the commit-
2 tee amendment in the nature of a substitute, as amended,
3 shall be considered as the original bill for the purpose of
4 further amendment. No further amendment to the com-
5 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute, as
6 amended, shall be in order except those printed in the por-
7 tion of the Congressional Record designated for that pur-
8 pose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed
9 shall be considered as read. The Chairman of the Commit-
10 tee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during
11 further consideration in the Committee of the Whole a re-
12 quest for a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) re-
13 duce to five minutes the minimum time for electronic vot-
14 ing on any postponed question that follows another elec-
15 tronic vote without intervening business, provided that the
16 minimum time for electronic voting on the first in any se-
17 ries of questions shall be fifteen minutes. At the conclusion
18 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
19 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
20 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
21 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
22 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
23 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
24 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
25 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without

- 1 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
- 2 or without instructions.
