A BILL

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF TERM OF APPOINTMENT OF**
4 **CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE PROSPECTIVE**
5 **PAYMENT ASSESSMENT COMMISSION AND**
6 **THE PHYSICIAN PAYMENT REVIEW COMMIS-**
7 **SION.**

8 In the case of an individual who is appointed as a
9 member of the Prospective Payment Assessment Commis-
10 sion or of the Physician Payment Review Commission and
11 whose term of appointment would otherwise expire during
12 1997, such term of appointment is hereby extended to ex-
13 pire as of May 1, 1998.

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
