JOINT RESOLUTION

To grant the consent of Congress to the boundary change
between Georgia and South Carolina.

- 1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
- 2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. CONSENT OF CONGRESS.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The consent of Congress is given
3 to the establishment of the boundary between the States
4 of Georgia and South Carolina.

5 (b) NEW BOUNDARY.—The boundary referred to in
6 subsection (a) is the boundary—

7 (1) agreed to by the State of Georgia in Act
8 Number 1044 (S.B. No. 572) approved by the Gov-
9 ernor on April 5, 1994, and agreed to by the State
10 of South Carolina in Act Number 375 (S.B. No.
11 1315) approved by the Governor on May 29, 1996;

12 (2) agreed to by the State of Georgia in Act
13 Number 1044 (S.B. No. 572) approved by the Gov-
14 ernor on April 5, 1994, and agreed to by the State
15 of South Carolina in an Act approved by its Gov-
16 ernor not later than 5 years after the date of the en-
17 actment of this joint resolution;

18 (3) agreed to by the State of South Carolina in
19 Act Number 375 (S.B. No. 1315) approved by the
20 Governor on May 29, 1996, and agreed to by the
21 State of Georgia in an Act approved by its Governor
22 not later than 5 years after the date of the enact-
23 ment of this joint resolution; or

24 (4) agreed to by the States of Georgia and
25 South Carolina in Acts approved by each of their

1 Governors not later than 5 years after the date of
2 the enactment of this joint resolution.

3 (c) COMPACT.—The Acts referred to in subsection (b)
4 are recognized by Congress as an interstate compact pur-
5 suant to section 10 of article I of the United States Con-
6 stitution.
