Mr. BARTLETT of Maryland introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To authorize the construction of a monument to honor those who have served the Nation's civil defense and emergency management programs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORITY.**

4 (a) GRANT OF AUTHORITY.—The United States Na-
5 tional Civil Defense Monument Commission (in this Act
6 referred to as the “Commission”), a private nonprofit or-
7 ganization organized under the laws of the State of Penn-
8 sylvania, is authorized to construct a Monument to honor
9 those who have served the Nation's civil defense and emer-
10 gency management programs.

1 (b) EXPIRATION.—The authority granted by this sec-
2 tion shall expire 7 years after the date of the enactment
3 of this Act, unless before the expiration of such 7-year
4 period—

5 (1) the approvals required by sections 2(a) and
6 (b) have been obtained; and

7 (2) the construction of the Monument has
8 begun.

9 **SEC. 2. SITE AND DESIGN.**

10 (a) SITE.—Subject to the approval of the Director
11 of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Com-
12 mission may select the site upon which the Monument will
13 be constructed. Such site shall be on Federal land con-
14 trolled by the Federal Emergency Management Agency at
15 Emmitsburg, Maryland.

16 (b) DESIGN.—Subject to the approval of the Director
17 of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Com-
18 mission may develop the design of the Monument.

19 **SEC. 3. CONSTRUCTION COSTS.**

20 The costs of constructing the Monument shall be paid
21 out of contributions to the Commission.

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
