Mr. REYNOLDS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

---

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1654) to authorize appropriations for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration for fiscal years 2000, 2001, and 2002, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 1654) to authorize appropriations  
6 for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration

1 for fiscal years 2000, 2001, and 2002, and for other pur-  
2 poses. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.  
3 Points of order against consideration of the bill for failure  
4 to comply with clause 4(a) of rule XIII are waived. Gen-  
5 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not ex-  
6 ceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair-  
7 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on  
8 Science. After general debate the bill shall be considered  
9 for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in  
10 order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of  
11 amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in  
12 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee  
13 on Science now printed in the bill. The committee amend-  
14 ment in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as  
15 read. Points of order against the amendment for failure  
16 to comply with clause 7 of rule XVI are waived. During  
17 consideration of the bill for amendment, the chairman of  
18 the Committee of the Whole may accord priority in rec-  
19 ognition on the basis of whether the Member offering an  
20 amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion of  
21 the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in  
22 clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall be  
23 considered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the  
24 Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further con-  
25 sideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for

1 a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five  
2 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any  
3 postponed question that follows another electronic vote  
4 without intervening business, provided that the minimum  
5 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-  
6 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-  
7 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise  
8 and report the bill to the House with such amendments  
9 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a  
10 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted  
11 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the com-  
12 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The pre-  
13 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill  
14 and amendments thereto to final passage without inter-  
15 vening motion except one motion to recommit with or  
16 without instructions.
