A BILL

To review the suitability and feasibility of recovering costs of high altitude rescues at Denali National Park and Preserve in the State of Alaska, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That no later than nine months after the enactment of
4 this Act, the Secretary of the Interior (hereinafter referred
5 to as the “Secretary”) shall complete a report on the suit-

1 ability and feasibility of recovering the costs of high alti-
2 tude rescues on Mt. McKinley, within Denali National
3 Park and Preserve. The Secretary shall also report on the
4 suitability and feasibility of requiring climbers to provide
5 proof of medical insurance prior to the issuance of a climb-
6 ing permit by the National Park Service. The report shall
7 also review the amount of fees charged for a climbing per-
8 mit and make such recommendations for changing the fee
9 structure as the Secretary deems appropriate. Upon com-
10 pletion, the report shall be submitted to the Committee
11 on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate, and the
12 Committee on Resources of the House of Representatives.

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
