A BILL

To amend the Shipping Act of 1984 to restore the application of the antitrust laws to certain agreements and conduct to which such Act applies.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Free Market Antitrust
5 Immunity Reform (FAIR) Act of 2001”.

6 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS.**

7 Section 7(a) of the Shipping Act of 1984 (46 U.S.C.
8 App. 1706(a)) is amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (1)—

2 (A) by inserting “entered into only among
3 marine terminal operators with respect to an
4 activity described in section 4(b)” after “agree-
5 ment”,

6 (B) by striking “section 5(d) or”, and

7 (C) by adding “and” at the end,

8 (2) in paragraph (2)—

9 (A) by striking “or agreement” and insert-
10 ing “, assessment agreement, or agreement of
11 the kind described in paragraph (1) that is”,
12 and

13 (B) by striking the semicolon at the end
14 and inserting a period, and

15 (3) by striking paragraphs (3), (4), (5), and
16 (6).

17 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE; APPLICATION OF AMENDMENTS.**

18 (a) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—Except as provided in sub-
19 section (b), this Act and the amendments made by this
20 Act shall take effect 1 year after the date of the enactment
21 of this Act.

22 (b) **APPLICATION OF AMENDMENTS.**—The amend-
23 ments made by this Act shall not apply with respect to
24 conduct occurring before the effective date of this Act.
