Mr. KUCINICH submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 808) to provide certain safeguards with respect to the domestic steel industry.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this
2 resolution the House shall resolve into the Committee of
3 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
4 ation of the bill (H.R. 808) to provide certain safeguards
5 with respect to the domestic steel industry. The first read-
6 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with and all points of
7 order against the bill and its consideration are waived.
8 General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not
9 exceed three hours, to be equally divided and controlled
10 by Mr. Kucinich of Ohio and a Member opposed thereto.

1 After general debate, the bill shall be considered as having
2 been read for amendment under the five-minute rule. The
3 amendment set forth in section 2 of this resolution shall
4 be considered as having been adopted in the House and
5 in the Committee of the Whole. No other amendment to
6 the bill shall be in order except two amendments to section
7 5 (excise tax on steel) (as amended by the amendment
8 set forth in section 2 of this resolution) of which one may
9 be offered by a majority party member and one by a mi-
10 nority party member. At the conclusion of the consider-
11 ation of the bill for amendment, the Committee shall rise
12 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
13 as may have been adopted. The previous question shall
14 be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments
15 thereto to final passage without intervening motion, except
16 one motion to recommit with or without instructions. If
17 the Committee of the Whole rises and reports that it has
18 come to no resolution on the bill, then on the next legisla-
19 tive day the House shall, immediately after the third daily
20 order of business under clause 1 of rule XIV, resolve into
21 the Committee of the Whole for further consideration of
22 the bill.

23 SEC. 2. The amendment referred to in section 1 is
24 as follows: Strike section 2 and titles I, III, and IV of
25 the bill; redesignate sections 201 through 204 as sections

- 1 2 through 5, respectively; strike the center heading of title
- 2 II; and redesignate the cross-references accordingly.
