Ms. PRYCE of Ohio, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of motions to suspend the rules.

1 *Resolved*, That it shall be in order at any time on
2 the legislative day of Wednesday, March 21, 2001, or
3 Thursday, March 22, 2001, for the Speaker to entertain
4 motions that the House suspend the rules relating to the
5 following measures:

6 (1) The concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res.
7 43) authorizing the printing of a revised and up-
8 dated version of the House document entitled
9 “Black Americans in Congress, 1870–1989”.

1 (2) The bill (H.R. 1042) to prevent the elimi-
2 nation of certain reports.

3 (3) The bill (H.R. 1098) to improve the record-
4 ing and discharging of maritime liens and expand
5 the American Merchant Marine Memorial Wall of
6 Honor, and for other purposes.

7 (4) The bill (H.R. 1099) to make changes in
8 laws governing Coast Guard personnel, increase ma-
9 rine safety, renew certain groups that advise the
10 Coast Guard on safety issues, make miscellaneous
11 improvements to Coast Guard operations and poli-
12 cies, and for other purposes.

13 (5) The bill (H.R. 496) to amend the Commu-
14 nications Act of 1934 to promote deployment of ad-
15 vanced services and foster the development of com-
16 petition for the benefit of consumers in all regions
17 of the Nation by relieving unnecessary burdens on
18 the Nation's two percent local exchange tele-
19 communications carriers, and for other purposes.

20 (6) The bill (H.R. 802) to authorize the Public
21 Safety Officer Medal of Valor, and for other pur-
22 poses.
