A BILL

To waive certain limitations in the case of use of the emergency fund authorized by section 125 of title 23, United States Code, to pay the costs of projects in response to the attack on the World Trade Center in New York City that occurred on September 11, 2001.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EXPENDITURES FOR EMERGENCY RELIEF IN**
2 **RESPONSE TO TERRORIST ATTACK.**

3 In the case of use of the emergency fund authorized
4 by section 125 of title 23, United States Code, to pay the
5 costs of projects in response to the attack on the World
6 Trade Center in New York City that occurred on Sep-
7 tember 11, 2001—

8 (1) notwithstanding section 120(e) of that title,
9 the Federal share of the cost of each such project
10 shall be 100 percent;

11 (2) notwithstanding section 125(c)(1) of that
12 title, the Secretary of Transportation may obligate
13 more than \$100,000,000 in any 1 fiscal year; and

14 (3) notwithstanding section 125(d)(1) of that
15 title, the Secretary of Transportation may obligate
16 more than \$100,000,000 for those projects.
