Authorizing expenditures by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

MARCH 7, 2001

Mr. CAMPBELL, from the Committee on Indian Affairs, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, and making investiga-
5 tions as authorized by paragraphs 1 and 8 of rule XXVI
6 of the Standing Rules of the Senate, the Committee on
7 Indian Affairs is authorized from March 1, 2001, through
8 February 28, 2003, in its discretion (1) to make expendi-
9 tures from the contingent fund of the Senate, (2) to em-
10 ploy personnel, and (3) with the prior consent of the Gov-

1 ernment department or agency concerned and the Com-
2 mittee on Rules and Administration, to use on a reimburs-
3 able or non-reimbursable basis the services of personnel
4 of any such department or agency.

5 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
6 period March 1, 2001, through September 30, 2001,
7 under this resolution shall not exceed \$970,754.00, of
8 which amount (1) no funds may be expended for the pro-
9 curement of the services of individual consultants, or orga-
10 nizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the
11 Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and
12 (2) not to exceed \$1,000 may be expended for the training
13 of professional staff of such committee (under procedures
14 specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganiza-
15 tion Act of 1946).

16 (b) For the period October 1, 2001, through Sep-
17 tember 30, 2002, expenses of the committee under this
18 resolution shall not exceed \$1,718,989.00, of which
19 amount (1) no funds may be expended for the procure-
20 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-
21 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-
22 lative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2)
23 not to exceed \$1,000 may be expended for the training
24 of professional staff of such committee (under procedures

1 specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganiza-
2 tion Act of 1946).

3 (c) For the period October 1, 2002, through Feb-
4 ruary 28, 2003, expenses of the committee under this res-
5 olution shall not exceed \$734,239.00, of which amount (1)
6 no funds may be expended for the procurement of the
7 services of individual consultants, or organizations thereof
8 (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorga-
9 nization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2) not to exceed
10 \$1,000 may be expended for the training of professional
11 staff of such committee (under procedures specified by
12 section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
13 1946).

14 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its finding, to-
15 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
16 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
17 date, but not later than February 28, 2001.

18 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
19 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
20 upon vouchers approved by the Chairman of the com-
21 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for
22 the disbursement of the salaries of employees paid at an
23 annual rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications
24 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
25 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of

1 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
2 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
3 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
4 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
5 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
6 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
7 Recording and Photographic Services, or (7) for payment
8 of franked and mass mail costs by the Sergeant at Arms
9 and Doorkeeper, United States Senate.

10 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
11 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
12 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
13 2001, through February 28, 2003, to be paid from the
14 Appropriations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and In-
15 vestigations”.

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
