Mr. CRENSHAW (for himself and Ms. CORRINE BROWN of Florida) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To expand the Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve,
Florida.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Timucuan Ecological
5 and Historic Preserve Boundary Revision Act of 2004”.

6 **SEC. 2. REVISION OF BOUNDARY OF TIMUCUAN ECOLOGI-**
7 **CAL AND HISTORIC PRESERVE, FLORIDA.**

8 Section 201(a) of Public Law 100–249 (16 U.S.C.
9 698n) is amended—

10 (1) by striking “(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There
11 is hereby” and inserting the following:

1 “(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—

2 “(1) IN GENERAL.—There is”; and

3 (2) by adding at the end the following:

4 “(2) MODIFICATION OF BOUNDARY.—

5 “(A) IN GENERAL.—In addition to the
6 land described in paragraph (1), the Preserve
7 shall include approximately 12.5 acres of land
8 located in Nassau County, Florida, as generally
9 depicted on the map entitled ‘Timucuan Eco-
10 logical and Historic Preserve American Beach
11 Adjustment’, numbered 006/80012 and dated
12 June 2003.

13 “(B) DUTIES OF SECRETARY.—The Sec-
14 retary of the Interior shall—

15 “(i) revise the boundaries of the Pre-
16 serve so as to encompass the land de-
17 scribed in subparagraph (A); and

18 “(ii) maintain the map described in
19 subparagraph (A) on file and available for
20 public inspection in the appropriate offices
21 of the National Park Service.”.

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
