A BILL

To provide for the protection of archaeological sites in the
Galisteo Basin in New Mexico, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 *This Act may be cited as the “Galisteo Basin Archae-*
3 *ological Sites Protection Act”.*

4 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.**

5 (a) *FINDINGS.*—*The Congress finds that—*

6 (1) *the Galisteo Basin and surrounding area of*
7 *New Mexico is the location of many well preserved*
8 *prehistoric and historic archaeological resources of*
9 *Native American and Spanish colonial cultures;*

10 (2) *these resources include the largest ruins of*
11 *Pueblo Indian settlements in the United States, spec-*
12 *tacular examples of Native American rock art, and*
13 *ruins of Spanish colonial settlements; and*

14 (3) *these resources are being threatened by nat-*
15 *ural causes, urban development, vandalism, and un-*
16 *controlled excavations.*

17 (b) *PURPOSE.*—*The purpose of this Act is to provide*
18 *for the preservation, protection, and interpretation of the*
19 *nationally significant archaeological resources in the*
20 *Galisteo Basin in New Mexico.*

21 **SEC. 3. GALISTEO BASIN ARCHAEOLOGICAL PROTECTION**
22 **SITES.**

23 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—*Except as provided in subsection*
24 *(d), the following archaeological sites located in the Galisteo*
25 *Basin in the State of New Mexico, totaling approximately*

1 4,591 acres, are hereby designated as Galisteo Basin Ar-
 2 chaeological Protection Sites:

3 (b) *AVAILABILITY OF MAPS.*—The archaeological pro-
 4 tection sites listed in subsection (a) are generally depicted
 5 on a series of 19 maps entitled “Galisteo Basin Archae-
 6 ological Protection Sites” and dated July, 2002. The Sec-
 7 retary of the Interior (hereinafter referred to as the “Sec-
 8 retary”) shall keep the maps on file and available for public
 9 inspection in appropriate offices in New Mexico of the Bu-
 10 reau of Land Management and the National Park Service.

11 (c) *BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENTS.*—The Secretary may
 12 make minor boundary adjustments to the archaeological

1 *protection sites by publishing notice thereof in the Federal*
 2 *Register.*

3 (d) *WITHDRAWAL OF PRIVATE PROPERTY.*—Upon the
 4 *written request of an owner of private property included*
 5 *within the boundary of an archaeological site protected*
 6 *under this Act, the Secretary shall immediately remove that*
 7 *private property from within that boundary.*

8 **SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL SITES.**

9 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—The Secretary shall—

10 (1) *continue to search for additional Native*
 11 *American and Spanish colonial sites in the Galisteo*
 12 *Basin area of New Mexico; and*

13 (2) *submit to Congress, within three years after*
 14 *the date funds become available and thereafter as*
 15 *needed, recommendations for additions to, deletions*
 16 *from, and modifications of the boundaries of the list*
 17 *of archaeological protection sites in section 3 of this*
 18 *Act.*

19 (b) *ADDITIONS ONLY BY STATUTE.*—Additions to or
 20 *deletions from the list in section 3 shall be made only by*
 21 *an Act of Congress.*

22 **SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION.**

23 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—

24 (1) *The Secretary shall administer archaeological*
 25 *protection sites located on Federal land in accordance*

1 *with the provisions of this Act, the Archaeological Re-*
2 *sources Protection Act of 1979 (16 U.S.C. 470aa et*
3 *seq.), the Native American Graves Protection and Re-*
4 *patriation Act (25 U.S.C. 3001 et seq.), and other ap-*
5 *plicable laws in a manner that will protect, preserve,*
6 *and maintain the archaeological resources and pro-*
7 *vide for research thereon.*

8 (2) *The Secretary shall have no authority to ad-*
9 *minister archaeological protection sites which are on*
10 *non-Federal lands except to the extent provided for in*
11 *a cooperative agreement entered into between the Sec-*
12 *retary and the landowner.*

13 (3) *Nothing in this Act shall be construed to ex-*
14 *tend the authorities of the Archaeological Resources*
15 *Protection Act of 1979 or the Native American Graves*
16 *Protection and Repatriation Act to private lands*
17 *which are designated as an archaeological protection*
18 *site.*

19 (b) *MANAGEMENT PLAN.—*

20 (1) *IN GENERAL.—Within three complete fiscal*
21 *years after the date funds are made available, the*
22 *Secretary shall prepare and transmit to the Com-*
23 *mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the*
24 *United States Senate and the Committee on Resources*
25 *of the United States House of Representatives, a gen-*

1 *eral management plan for the identification, research,*
 2 *protection, and public interpretation of—*

3 *(A) the archaeological protection sites lo-*
 4 *cated on Federal land; and*

5 *(B) for sites on State or private lands for*
 6 *which the Secretary has entered into cooperative*
 7 *agreements pursuant to section 6 of this Act.*

8 *(2) CONSULTATION.—The general management*
 9 *plan shall be developed by the Secretary in consulta-*
 10 *tion with the Governor of New Mexico, the New Mex-*
 11 *ico State Land Commissioner, affected Native Amer-*
 12 *ican pueblos, and other interested parties.*

13 **SEC. 6. COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.**

14 *The Secretary is authorized to enter into cooperative*
 15 *agreements with owners of non-Federal lands with regard*
 16 *to an archaeological protection site, or portion thereof, lo-*
 17 *cated on their property. The purpose of such an agreement*
 18 *shall be to enable the Secretary to assist with the protection,*
 19 *preservation, maintenance, and administration of the ar-*
 20 *chaeological resources and associated lands. Where appro-*
 21 *priate, a cooperative agreement may also provide for public*
 22 *interpretation of the site.*

23 **SEC. 7. ACQUISITIONS.**

24 *(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary is authorized to ac-*
 25 *quire lands and interests therein within the boundaries of*

1 *the archaeological protection sites, including access thereto,*
 2 *by donation, by purchase with donated or appropriated*
 3 *funds, or by exchange.*

4 (b) *CONSENT OF OWNER REQUIRED.—The Secretary*
 5 *may only acquire lands or interests therein with the consent*
 6 *of the owner thereof.*

7 (c) *STATE LANDS.—The Secretary may acquire lands*
 8 *or interests therein owned by the State of New Mexico or*
 9 *a political subdivision thereof only by donation or exchange,*
 10 *except that State trust lands may only be acquired by ex-*
 11 *change.*

12 **SEC. 8. WITHDRAWAL.**

13 *Subject to valid existing rights, all Federal lands with-*
 14 *in the archaeological protection sites are hereby with-*
 15 *drawn—*

16 (1) *from all forms of entry, appropriation, or*
 17 *disposal under the public land laws and all amend-*
 18 *ments thereto;*

19 (2) *from location, entry, and patent under the*
 20 *mining law and all amendments thereto; and*

21 (3) *from disposition under all laws relating to*
 22 *mineral and geothermal leasing, and all amendments*
 23 *thereto.*

24 **SEC. 9. SAVINGS PROVISIONS.**

25 *Nothing in this Act shall be construed—*

1 (1) to authorize the regulation of privately
2 owned lands within an area designated as an archae-
3 ological protection site;

4 (2) to modify, enlarge, or diminish any author-
5 ity of Federal, State, or local governments to regulate
6 any use of privately owned lands;

7 (3) to modify, enlarge, or diminish any author-
8 ity of Federal, State, tribal, or local governments to
9 manage or regulate any use of land as provided for
10 by law or regulation; or

11 (4) to restrict or limit a tribe from protecting
12 cultural or religious sites on tribal lands.

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
