Mr. PRYOR introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To recognize the sacrifices of the members of the Armed Forces who are injured in combat, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Service Act for Care
5 and Relief Initiatives for Forces Injured in Combat En-
6 gagements of 2004” or “SACRIFICE of 2004”.

7 **SEC. 2. SENSE OF SENATE.**

8 (a) FINDINGS.—The Senate makes the following
9 findings:

1 (1) Members of the Armed Forces of the
2 United States place themselves in harms way in the
3 defense of democratic values and to keep the United
4 States safe.

5 (2) This call to duty has resulted in the ulti-
6 mate SACRIFICE of members of the Armed Forces
7 of the United States who are killed or critically in-
8 jured while serving the United States.

9 (b) SENSE OF SENATE.—It is the sense of the Sen-
10 ate—

11 (1) to honor the SACRIFICE of the members
12 of the Armed Forces who have been killed or criti-
13 cally wounded while serving the United States;

14 (2) to recognize the heroic efforts of the med-
15 ical personnel of the Armed Forces in treating
16 wounded military personnel and civilians; and

17 (3) to support advanced medical technologies
18 that assist the medical personnel of the Armed
19 Forces in saving lives and reducing disability rates
20 for members of the Armed Forces.

21 **SEC. 3. POLICY ON TRACKING OF WOUNDED FROM COMBAT**
22 **ZONES.**

23 (a) POLICY.—Not later than 120 days after the date
24 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense
25 shall—

(b) ELEMENTS.—The policy prescribed under sub-
section (a) shall ensure respect for the expressed desires
of individual members of the Armed Forces regarding no-
tification of next of kin under the policy, and shall also
include standards of timeliness for the initial and con-
tinuing notification of next of kin under the policy.

(a) FUNDING FOR MEDICAL EQUIPMENT AND COM-
BAT CASUALTY TECHNOLOGIES.—(1) Funds are hereby
authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2005 for the
use of the Department of Defense for research, develop-
ment, test, and evaluation, Defense-wide activities, in the
amount of \$10,000,000.

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tion, Defense-wide activities, \$10,000,000 shall be allocated to Program Element PE 0603826D8Z and available for medical equipment and combat casualty care technologies.

(b) OFFSET.—(1) Of the amount authorized to be appropriated by section 301(1) of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005 for operation and maintenance for the Army, \$2,500,000 of the amount otherwise available for travel shall not be available for any purpose.

(2) Of the amount authorized to be appropriated by section 301(2) of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005 for operation and maintenance for the Navy, \$2,500,000 of the amount otherwise available for travel shall not be available for any purpose.

(3) Of the amount authorized to be appropriated by section 301(3) of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005 for operation and maintenance for the Air Force, \$2,500,000 of the amount otherwise available for travel shall not be available for any purpose.

(4) Of the amount authorized to be appropriated by section 301(5) of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005 for operation and maintenance for Defense-wide activities, \$2,500,000 of the amount other-
