AN ACT

To provide for the conveyance of a small parcel of Bureau of Land Management land in Douglas County, Oregon, to the county to improve management of and recreational access to the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. CONVEYANCE OF BUREAU OF LAND MANAGE-**
2 **MENT LAND IN DOUGLAS COUNTY, OREGON.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—

4 (1) CONVEYANCE.—The Secretary of the Inte-
5 rior shall convey, without consideration and subject
6 to valid existing rights, to Douglas County, Oregon
7 (referred to in this section as the “County”), all
8 right, title, and interest of the United States in and
9 to the parcel described in paragraph (2) for use by
10 the County for recreational purposes.

11 (2) PARCEL.—The parcel referred to in para-
12 graph (1) is the parcel of land consisting of approxi-
13 mately 68.8 acres under the administrative jurisdic-
14 tion of the Bureau of Land Management, as gen-
15 erally depicted on the map entitled “S. 714, Douglas
16 County, Oregon Land Conveyance”, dated May 21,
17 2003.

18 (b) PURPOSES OF CONVEYANCE.—The purposes of
19 the conveyance under subsection (a) are to improve man-
20 agement of and recreational access to the Oregon Dunes
21 National Recreation Area by—

22 (1) improving public safety and reducing traffic
23 congestion along Salmon Harbor Drive (County
24 Road No. 251) in the County;

25 (2) providing a staging area for off-highway ve-
26 hicles; and

7 (1) that is satisfactory to the Secretary; and

(d) ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The Secretary may require such additional terms and conditions in connection with the conveyance under subsection (a) as the Secretary considers appropriate to protect the interests of the United States.
