RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3058) making appropriations for the Departments of Transportation, Treasury, and Housing and Urban Development, the Judiciary, District of Columbia, and independent agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2006, and for other purposes.

- 1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
- 3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 3058) making appropriations for
3 the Departments of Transportation, Treasury, and Hous-
4 ing and Urban Development, the Judiciary, District of Co-
5 lumbia, and independent agencies for the fiscal year end-
6 ing September 30, 2006, and for other purposes. The first
7 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of
8 order against consideration of the bill are waived. General
9 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed
10 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman
11 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appro-
12 priations. After general debate the bill shall be considered
13 for amendment under the five-minute rule. Points of order
14 against provisions in the bill for failure to comply with
15 clause 2 of rule XXI are waived except as follows: begin-
16 ning with the comma on page 5, line 25, through “and”
17 on line 26; beginning with “for” on page 11, line 22,
18 through the first comma on page 12, line 1; beginning
19 with the colon on page 12, line 12, through “Program”
20 on line 17; beginning with “Notwithstanding” on page 16,
21 line 8, through the comma on line 8; sections 110, 112
22 and 130; beginning with the colon on page 32, line 25,
23 through “Congress” on page 33, line 3; beginning with
24 “Notwithstanding” on page 34, line 4, through the comma
25 on line 4; and sections 151, 218, 808, 928, and 945.

1 Where points of order are waived against part of a para-
2 graph or section, points of order against a provision in
3 another part of such paragraph or section may be made
4 only against such provision and not against the entire
5 paragraph or section. During consideration of the bill for
6 amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole
7 may accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether
8 the Member offering an amendment has caused it to be
9 printed in the portion of the Congressional Record des-
10 ignated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII. Amend-
11 ments so printed shall be considered as read. When the
12 committee rises and reports the bill back to the House
13 with a recommendation that the bill do pass, the previous
14 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
15 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
16 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
17 structions.
