A BILL

To restore the prohibition on the commercial sale and slaughter of wild free-roaming horses and burros.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SALE OF WILD FREE-ROAMING HORSES AND**
4 **BURROS.**

5 (a) PROHIBITION.—Section 3 of Public Law 92–195
6 (16 U.S.C. 1333) (as amended by section 142(a) of Public
7 Law 108–447 (118 Stat. 3070)) is amended by striking
8 subsection (e) and inserting the following:

9 “(e) PROHIBITION OF SALE OF WILD FREE-ROAMING
10 HORSES AND BURROS.—No wild free-roaming horse or

1 burro or the remains of a wild free-roaming horse or burro
2 may be sold or transferred for consideration for processing
3 into commercial products.”.

4 (b) CRIMINAL PROVISIONS.—Section 8(a)(4) of Pub-
5 lic Law 92–195 (16 U.S.C. 1338(a)(4)) (as amended by
6 section 142(b) of Public Law 108–447 (118 Stat. 3071))
7 is amended by striking “except as provided in section
8 3(e),”.
