AN ACT

To amend and reauthorize the Junior Duck Stamp
Conservation and Design Program Act of 1994.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Junior Duck Stamp
5 Conservation and Design Program Reauthorization Act of
6 2009”.

7 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

8 Congress finds the following:

1 (1) In 2007–2008, sales of the \$5 Junior Duck
2 Stamp generated more than \$100,000 in revenue, all
3 of which was used to provide educational materials
4 for the program, fund scholarships for students, and
5 support and promote the program’s goal of con-
6 necting children with nature.

7 (2) Now in its 20th year, the Junior Duck
8 Stamp Conservation and Design Program is one of
9 this country’s oldest and most successful govern-
10 ment-sponsored, youth-focused conservation biology
11 programs. The program continues to build strong
12 partnerships with public and parochial schools,
13 homeschoolers and after-school programs, and other
14 youth-focused education programs throughout the
15 country.

16 (3) The Junior Duck Stamp Conservation and
17 Design Program continues to foster strong partner-
18 ships among Federal and State government agen-
19 cies, nongovernment organizations, the business
20 community, and others in the private sector to pro-
21 mote youth conservation initiatives.

22 (4) With its conservation-focused science and
23 arts curriculum, the Junior Duck Stamp Conserva-
24 tion and Design Program has helped prepare hun-
25 dreds of thousands of students to become stewards

1 of America's irreplaceable wild places and treasured
2 outdoor heritage.

3 **SEC. 3. REPORTING REQUIREMENT.**

4 Section 2(c)(2) of the Junior Duck Stamp Conserva-
5 tion and Design Program Act of 1994 (16 U.S.C.
6 719(c)(2)) is amended to read as follows:

7 “(2) REPORTING REQUIREMENT.—Beginning in
8 2010 and every 5 years thereafter, the Secretary
9 shall submit to Congress a report on the status of
10 the Program in each State.”.

11 **SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

12 Section 6 of the Junior Duck Stamp Conservation
13 and Design Program Act of 1994 (16 U.S.C. 719c) is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 **“SEC. 6. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

16 “There is authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-
17 retary for administrative expenses of the Program
18 \$500,000 for each of fiscal years 2010 through 2015.”.
