A BILL

To redesignate the Longfellow National Historic Site, Massachusetts, as the “Longfellow House-Washington’s Headquarters National Historic Site”.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Longfellow House-
3 Washington’s Headquarters National Historic Site Des-
4 ignation Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. REDESIGNATION OF LONGFELLOW NATIONAL HIS-**
6 **TORIC SITE, MASSACHUSETTS.**

7 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The Longfellow National Historic
8 Site in Cambridge, Massachusetts, shall be known and
9 designated as “Longfellow House-Washington’s Head-
10 quarters National Historic Site”.

11 (b) **REFERENCES.**—Any reference in a law, map, reg-
12 ulation, document, paper, or other record of the United
13 States to the Longfellow National Historic Site shall be
14 considered to be a reference to the “Longfellow House-
15 Washington’s Headquarters National Historic Site”.
