

In the Senate of the United States,

Resolved, That the Senate agrees to the House of Representatives amendment to the title of the bill (S. 1510) entitled “An Act to transfer statutory entitlements to pay and hours of work authorized by laws codified in the District of Columbia Official Code for current members of the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division from such laws to the United States Code, and for other purposes.”.

Resolved, That the Senate concurs in the House of Representatives amendment to the above-entitled bill, with the following

SENATE AMENDMENT TO HOUSE AMENDMENT:

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; PURPOSE.

2 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
3 “United States Secret Service Uniformed Division Mod-
4 ernization Act of 2010”.

1 (b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to transfer
 2 statutory entitlements to pay and hours of work author-
 3 ized by laws codified in the District of Columbia Official
 4 Code for current members of the United States Secret
 5 Service Uniformed Division from such laws to the United
 6 States Code.

7 **SEC. 2. HUMAN RESOURCES FOR UNITED STATES SECRET**
 8 **SERVICE UNIFORMED DIVISION.**

9 (a) PAY FOR MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES SE-
 10 CRET SERVICE UNIFORMED DIVISION.—Subpart I of part
 11 III of title 5, United States Code, is amended by adding
 12 at the end the following:

13 **“CHAPTER 102—UNITED STATES SECRET**
 14 **SERVICE UNIFORMED DIVISION PER-**
 15 **SONNEL**

16 **“§ 10201. Definitions**

17 “In this chapter—

18 “(1) the term ‘member’ means an employee of
 19 the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division

1 having the authorities described under section
2 3056A(b) of title 18;

3 “(2) the term ‘Secretary’ means the Secretary
4 of the Department of Homeland Security; and

5 “(3) the term ‘United States Secret Service
6 Uniformed Division’ has the meaning given that
7 term under section 3056A of title 18.

8 **“§ 10202. Authorities**

9 “(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary is authorized to—

10 “(1) fix and adjust rates of basic pay for mem-
11 bers of the United States Secret Service Uniformed
12 Division, subject to the requirements of this chapter;

13 “(2) determine what constitutes an acceptable
14 level of competence for the purposes of section
15 10205;

16 “(3) establish and determine the positions at
17 the Officer and Sergeant ranks to be included as
18 technician positions; and

19 “(4) determine the rate of basic pay of a mem-
20 ber who is changed or demoted to a lower rank, in
21 accordance with section 10208.

22 “(b) DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY.—The Secretary is
23 authorized to delegate to the designated agent or agents
24 of the Secretary, any power or function vested in the Sec-
25 retary under in this chapter.

1 “(c) REGULATIONS.—The Secretary may prescribe
2 such regulations as may be necessary to administer this
3 chapter.

4 **“§ 10203. Basic pay**

5 “(a) IN GENERAL.—The annual rates of basic pay
6 of members of the United States Secret Service Uniformed
7 Division shall be fixed in accordance with the following
8 schedule of rates, except that the payable annual rate of
9 basic pay for positions at the Lieutenant, Captain, and
10 Inspector ranks is limited to 95 percent of the rate of pay
11 for level V of the Executive Schedule under subchapter
12 II of chapter 53.

1 “(b) SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT.—

2 “(1)(A) Effective at the beginning of the first
3 pay period commencing on or after the first day of
4 the month in which an adjustment in the rates of
5 basic pay under the General Schedule takes effect
6 under section 5303 or other authority, the schedule
7 of annual rates of basic pay of members (except the
8 Deputy Chiefs, Assistant Chief and Chief) shall be
9 adjusted by the Secretary by a percentage amount
10 corresponding to the percentage adjustment made in
11 the rates of pay under the General Schedule.

12 “(B) The Secretary may establish a method-
13 ology of schedule adjustment that—

14 “(i) results in uniform fixed-dollar step in-
15 crements within any given rank; and

16 “(ii) preserves the established percentage
17 differences among rates of different ranks at
18 the same step position.

19 “(2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), the pay-
20 able annual rate of basic pay for positions at the
21 Lieutenant, Captain, and Inspector ranks after ad-
22 justment under paragraph (1) may not exceed 95
23 percent of the rate of pay for level V of the Execu-
24 tive Schedule under subchapter II of chapter 53.

1 “(3) Locality-based comparability payments au-
2 thorized under section 5304 shall be applicable to
3 the basic pay for all ranks under this section, except
4 locality-based comparability payments may not be
5 paid at a rate which, when added to the rate of basic
6 pay otherwise payable to the member, would cause
7 the total to exceed the rate of basic pay payable for
8 level IV of the Executive Schedule.

9 **“§ 10204. Rate of pay for original appointments**

10 “(a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
11 (b), all original appointments shall be made at the min-
12 imum rate of basic pay for the Officer rank set forth in
13 the schedule in section 10203.

14 “(b) EXCEPTION FOR SUPERIOR QUALIFICATIONS OR
15 SPECIAL NEED.—The Director of the United States Se-
16 cret Service or the designee of the Director may appoint
17 an individual at a rate above the minimum rate of basic
18 pay for the Officer rank based on the individual’s superior
19 qualifications or a special need of the Government for the
20 individual’s services.

21 **“§ 10205. Service step adjustments**

22 “(a) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term ‘cal-
23 endar week of active service’ includes all periods of leave
24 with pay or other paid time off, and periods of non-pay

1 status which do not cumulatively equal one 40-hour work-
2 week.

3 “(b) ADJUSTMENTS.—Each member whose current
4 performance is at an acceptable level of competence shall
5 have a service step adjustment as follows:

6 “(1) Each member in service step 1, 2, or 3
7 shall be advanced successively to the next higher
8 service step at the beginning of the first pay period
9 immediately following the completion of 52 calendar
10 weeks of active service in the member’s service step.

11 “(2) Each member in service step 4, 5, 6, 7, 8,
12 9, 10, or 11 shall be advanced successively to the
13 next higher service step at the beginning of the first
14 pay period immediately following the completion of
15 104 calendar weeks of active service in the member’s
16 service step.

17 “(3) Each member in service step 12 shall be
18 advanced successively to the next higher service step
19 at the beginning of the first pay period immediately
20 following the completion of 156 calendar weeks of
21 active service in the member’s service step.

22 **“§ 10206. Technician positions**

23 “(a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Each member whose position
24 is determined under section 10202(a)(3) to be included
25 as a technician position shall, on or after such date, re-

1 ceive, in addition to the member's scheduled rate of basic
2 pay, an amount equal to 6 percent of the sum of such
3 member's rate of basic pay and the applicable locality-
4 based comparability payment.

5 “(2) A member described in this subsection shall re-
6 ceive the additional compensation authorized by this sub-
7 section until such time as the member's position is deter-
8 mined under section 10202(a)(3) not to be a technician
9 position, or until the member no longer occupies such posi-
10 tion, whichever occurs first.

11 “(3) The additional compensation authorized by this
12 subsection shall be paid to a member in the same manner
13 and at the same time as the member's basic pay is paid.

14 “(b) EXCEPTIONS.—(1) Except as provided in para-
15 graph (2), the additional compensation authorized by sub-
16 section (a)(1) shall be considered as basic pay for all pur-
17 poses, including section 8401(4).

18 “(2) The additional compensation authorized by sub-
19 section (a)(1) shall not be considered as basic pay for the
20 purposes of—

21 “(A) section 5304; or

22 “(B) section 7511(a)(4).

23 “(3) The loss of the additional compensation author-
24 ized by subsection (a)(1) shall not constitute an adverse
25 action for the purposes of section 7512.

1 **“§ 10207. Promotions**

2 “(a) IN GENERAL.—Each member who is promoted
3 to a higher rank shall receive basic pay at the same step
4 at which such member was being compensated prior to the
5 date of the promotion.

6 “(b) CREDIT FOR SERVICE.—For the purposes of a
7 service step adjustment under section 10205, periods of
8 service at the lower rank shall be credited in the same
9 manner as if it was service at the rank to which the em-
10 ployee is promoted.

11 **“§ 10208. Demotions**

12 “When a member is changed or demoted from any
13 rank to a lower rank, the Secretary may fix the member’s
14 rate of basic pay at the rate of pay for any step in the
15 lower rank which does not exceed the lowest step in the
16 lower rank for which the rate of basic pay is equal to or
17 greater than the member’s existing rate of basic pay.

18 **“§ 10209. Clothing allowances**

19 “(a) IN GENERAL.—In addition to the benefits pro-
20 vided under section 5901, the Director of the United
21 States Secret Service or the designee of the Director is
22 authorized to provide a clothing allowance to a member
23 assigned to perform duties in normal business or work at-
24 tire purchased at the discretion of the employee. Such
25 clothing allowance shall not to be treated as part of the
26 member’s basic pay for any purpose (including retirement

1 purposes) and shall not be used for the purpose of com-
2 puting the member's overtime pay, pay during leave or
3 other paid time off, lump-sum payments under section
4 5551 or section 5552, workers' compensation, or any other
5 benefit. Such allowance for any member may be discon-
6 tinued at any time upon written notification by the Direc-
7 tor of the United States Secret Service or the designee
8 of the Director.

9 “(b) MAXIMUM AMOUNT AUTHORIZED.—A clothing
10 allowance authorized under this section shall not exceed
11 \$500 per annum.

12 **“§ 10210. Reporting requirement**

13 “Not later than 3 years after the date of the enact-
14 ment of this chapter, the Secretary shall prepare and
15 transmit to Congress a report on the operation of this
16 chapter. The report shall include—

17 “(1) an assessment of the effectiveness of this
18 chapter with respect to efforts of the Secretary to
19 recruit and retain well-qualified personnel; and

20 “(2) recommendations for any legislation or ad-
21 ministrative action which the Secretary considers ap-
22 propriate.”.

23 (b) ANNUAL LEAVE LIMITATION FOR MEMBERS IN
24 THE DEPUTY CHIEF, ASSISTANT CHIEF, AND CHIEF

1 RANKS.—Section 6304(f)(1) of title 5, United States
2 Code, is amended—

3 (1) in subparagraph (F), by striking “or” after
4 the semicolon;

5 (2) in subparagraph (G), by striking the period
6 and inserting “; or”; and

7 (3) by adding at the end the following:

8 “(H) a position in the United States Se-
9 cret Service Uniformed Division at the rank of
10 Deputy Chief, Assistant Chief, or Chief.”.

11 (c) SICK LEAVE FOR WORK-RELATED INJURIES AND
12 ILLNESSES.—Section 6324 of title 5, United States Code,
13 is amended—

14 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “Executive
15 Protective Service force” and inserting “United
16 States Secret Service Uniformed Division”;

17 (2) in subsection (b)(3), by striking “the Treas-
18 ury for the Executive Protective Service force” and
19 inserting “Homeland Security for the United States
20 Secret Service Uniformed Division”; and

21 (3) by adding at the end the following:

22 “(c) This section shall not apply to members of the
23 United States Secret Service Uniformed Division who are
24 covered under chapter 84 for the purpose of retirement
25 benefits.”.

1 **SEC. 3. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.**

2 (a) CONVERSION TO NEW SALARY SCHEDULE.—

3 (1) IN GENERAL.—

4 (A) RATES OF PAY FIXED.—Effective the
5 first day of the first pay period which begins
6 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the
7 Secretary shall fix the rates of basic pay for
8 members of the United States Secret Service
9 Uniformed Division, as defined under section
10 10201 of title 5, United States Code, (as added
11 by section 2(a)) in accordance with the provi-
12 sions of this subsection.

13 (B) RATE BASED ON CREDITABLE SERV-
14 ICE.—

15 (i) IN GENERAL.—Each member shall
16 be placed in and receive basic pay at the
17 corresponding scheduled rate under chap-
18 ter 102 of title 5, United States Code, as
19 added by section 2(a) (after any adjust-
20 ment under paragraph (3) of this sub-
21 section) in accordance with the member's
22 total years of creditable service, as pro-
23 vided in the table in this clause. If the
24 scheduled rate of basic pay for the step to
25 which the member would be assigned in ac-
26 cordance with this paragraph is lower than

1 the member's rate of basic pay imme-
 2 diately before the date of enactment of this
 3 paragraph, the member shall be placed in
 4 and receive basic pay at the next higher
 5 service step, subject to the provisions of
 6 clause (iv). If the member's rate of pay ex-
 7 ceeds the highest step of the rank, the rate
 8 of basic pay shall be determined in accord-
 9 ance with clause (iv).

10 (ii) CREDITABLE SERVICE.—For the
 11 purposes of this subsection, a member's
 12 creditable service is any police service in

1 pay status with the United States Secret
2 Service Uniformed Division, the United
3 States Park Police, or the District of Co-
4 lumbia Metropolitan Police Department.

5 (iii) STEP 13 CONVERSION MAXIMUM
6 RATE.—

7 (I) IN GENERAL.—A member
8 who, at the time of conversion, is in
9 step 13 of any rank below Deputy
10 Chief, is entitled to that rate of basic
11 pay which is the greater of—

12 (aa) the rate of pay for step
13 13 under the new salary sched-
14 ule; or

15 (bb) the rate of pay for step
16 14 under the pay schedule in ef-
17 fect immediately before conver-
18 sion.

19 (II) STEP 14 RATE.—Clause (iv)
20 shall apply to a member whose pay is
21 set in accordance with subclause
22 (I)(bb).

23 (iv) ADJUSTMENT BASED ON FORMER
24 RATE OF PAY.—

1 (I) DEFINITION.—In this clause,
2 the term “former rate of basic pay”
3 means the rate of basic pay last re-
4 ceived by a member before the conver-
5 sion.

6 (II) IN GENERAL.—If, as a result
7 of conversion to the new salary sched-
8 ule, the member’s former rate of basic
9 pay is greater than the maximum rate
10 of basic pay payable for the rank of
11 the member’s position immediately
12 after the conversion, the member is
13 entitled to basic pay at a rate equal to
14 the member’s former rate of basic
15 pay, and increased at the time of any
16 increase in the maximum rate of basic
17 pay payable for the rank of the mem-
18 ber’s position by 50 percent of the
19 dollar amount of each such increase.

20 (III) PROMOTIONS.—For the
21 purpose of applying section 10207 of
22 title 5, United States Code, relating to
23 promotions, (as added by section 2(a))
24 an employee receiving a rate above the
25 maximum rate as provided under this

1 clause shall be deemed to be at step
2 13.

3 (2) CREDIT FOR SERVICE.—Each member
4 whose position is converted to the salary schedule
5 under chapter 102 of title 5, United States Code,
6 (as added by section 2(a)) in accordance with this
7 subsection shall be granted credit for purposes of
8 such member's first service step adjustment made
9 after conversion to the salary schedule under that
10 chapter for all satisfactory service performed by the
11 member since the member's last increase in basic
12 pay before the adjustment under this section.

13 (3) ADJUSTMENTS DURING TRANSITION.—The
14 schedule of rates of basic pay shall be increased by
15 the percentage of any annual adjustment applicable
16 to the General Schedule authorized under section
17 5303 of title 5, United States Code, or any other au-
18 thority, which takes effect during the period begin-
19 ning on January 1, 2010, through the last day of
20 the last pay period preceding the first pay period
21 which begins after the date of the enactment of this
22 Act. The Secretary of Homeland Security may es-
23 tablish a methodology of schedule adjustment that
24 results in uniform fixed-dollar step increments with-
25 in any given rank and preserves the established per-

1 centage differences among rates of different ranks at
2 the same step position.

3 (b) IMPACT ON BENEFITS UNDER THE DISTRICT OF
4 COLUMBIA POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS' RETIREMENT
5 AND DISABILITY SYSTEM.—

6 (1) SALARY INCREASES FOR PURPOSES OF CER-
7 TAIN PENSIONS AND ALLOWANCES.—For purposes
8 of section 3 of the Act entitled “An Act to provide
9 increased pensions for widows and children of de-
10 ceased members of the Police Department and the
11 Fire Department of the District of Columbia”, ap-
12 proved August 4, 1949 (sec. 5–744, D.C. Official
13 Code) and section 301 of the District of Columbia
14 Police and Firemen's Salary Act of 1953 (sec. 5–
15 745, D.C. Official Code)—

16 (A) the conversion of positions and mem-
17 bers of the United States Secret Service Uni-
18 formed Division to appropriate ranks in the sal-
19 ary schedule set forth in this Act and the
20 amendments made by this Act shall not be
21 treated as an increase in the salary of individ-
22 uals who are members of the United States Se-
23 cret Service Uniformed Division on the date of
24 the enactment of this Act; and

1 (B) any adjustment of rates of basic pay
2 of those positions and individuals in accordance
3 with this Act and the amendments made by this
4 Act which is made after such conversion shall
5 be treated as an increase in the salary of indi-
6 viduals who are members of the United States
7 Secret Service Uniformed Division on the date
8 of the enactment of this Act.

9 (2) TREATMENT OF RETIREMENT BENEFITS
10 AND PENSIONS OF CURRENT AND FORMER MEM-
11 BERS.—Except as otherwise provided in this Act,
12 nothing in this Act shall affect retirement benefits
13 and pensions of current members and former mem-
14 bers who have retired under the District of Columbia
15 Police and Firefighters' Retirement and Disability
16 System.

17 **SEC. 4. TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.**

18 (a) IN GENERAL.—To the extent that any provision
19 of any law codified in the District of Columbia Official
20 Code that authorizes an entitlement to pay or hours of
21 work for current members of the United States Secret
22 Service Uniformed Division is not expressly revoked by
23 this Act, such provision shall not apply to such members
24 after the effective date of this Act.

1 (b) TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENTS TO
 2 LAWS CODIFIED IN DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA OFFICIAL
 3 CODE.—The following laws codified in the District of Co-
 4 lumbia Official Code are amended as follows:

5 (1) The Act entitled “An Act to provide for
 6 granting to officers and members of the Metropoli-
 7 tan Police force, the Fire Department of the District
 8 of Columbia, and the White House and United
 9 States Park Police forces additional compensation
 10 for working on holidays”, approved October 24,
 11 1951, is amended—

12 (A) in the second sentence of section 1
 13 (sec. 5–521.01, D.C. Official Code), by striking
 14 “the Fire Department of the District of Colum-
 15 bia,” and all that follows through “and the
 16 United States Park Police Force” and inserting
 17 “the Fire Department of the District of Colum-
 18 bia, and the United States Park Police Force”;

19 (B) in section 2 (sec. 5–521.02, D.C. Offi-
 20 cial Code), by striking “and with respect” and
 21 all that follows through “United States Park
 22 Police force” and inserting “and with respect to
 23 officers and members of the United States Park
 24 Police force”; and

1 (C) in section 3 (sec. 5–521.03, D.C. Offi-
2 cial Code), by striking “shall be applicable” and
3 all that follows and inserting the following:
4 “shall be applicable to the United States Park
5 Police force under regulations promulgated by
6 the Secretary of the Interior.”.

7 (2) The District of Columbia Police and Fire-
8 men’s Salary Act of 1958 is amended as follows:

9 (A) In section 202 (sec. 5–542.02, D.C.
10 Official Code), by striking “United States Se-
11 cret Service Uniformed Division,”.

12 (B) In section 301(b) (sec. 5–543.01(b),
13 D.C. Official Code), by striking “the United
14 States Secret Service Uniformed Division,”.

15 (C) In section 302 (sec. 5–543.02, D.C.
16 Official Code)—

17 (i) in subsection (a), by striking “the
18 Secretary of Treasury, in the case of the
19 United States Secret Service Uniformed
20 Division,”;

21 (ii) in subsection (b), by striking “the
22 United States Secret Service Uniformed
23 Division or”; and

1 (iii) in subsection (e), by striking “the
2 United States Secret Service Uniformed
3 Division or”.

4 (D) In section 303(a)(5) (sec. 5–
5 543.03(a)(5), D.C. Official Code), by striking
6 “the United States Secret Service Uniformed
7 Division and”.

8 (E) In section 304(d)(1) (sec. 5–
9 543.04(d)(1)), by striking “the United States
10 Secret Service Uniformed Division or”.

11 (F) In section 305 (sec. 5–543.05, D.C.
12 Official Code)—

13 (i) by striking “the United States Se-
14 cret Service Uniformed Division,”; and

15 (ii) by striking “or the Secretary of
16 the Treasury,”.

17 (G) In section 501 (sec. 5–545.01, D.C.
18 Official Code)—

19 (i) in subsection (a), by striking “and
20 the United States Secret Service Uni-
21 formed Division”;

22 (ii) in subsection (c)(1)—

23 (I) by striking “the United
24 States Secret Service Uniformed Divi-
25 sion and”; and

1 (II) in the schedule set forth in
 2 such subsection, by striking “United
 3 States Secret Service Uniformed Divi-
 4 sion”;

5 (iii) in subsection (c)(2), by striking
 6 “the annual rates of basic compensation”
 7 and all that follows through “the Secretary
 8 of the Treasury, and”;

9 (iv) in subsection (c)(5), by striking
 10 “officers and members of the United
 11 States Secret Service Uniformed Division
 12 or”;

13 (v) in subsection (c)(6)(A), by striking
 14 “the United States Secret Service Uni-
 15 formed Division or”; and

16 (vi) in subsection (c)(7)(A), by strik-
 17 ing “the United States Secret Service Uni-
 18 formed Division or”.

19 (H) In section 506 (sec. 5–545.06, D.C.
 20 Official Code), by striking “, the Secretary of
 21 the Treasury,”.

22 (3) Section 118 of the Treasury and General
 23 Government Appropriations Act, 1998, is amended
 24 by striking subsection (b) (sec. 5–561.01, D.C. Offi-
 25 cial Code).

1 (4) Section 905(a)(1) of the Law Enforcement
2 Pay Equity Act of 2000 (Public Law 106–554; sec.
3 5–561.02(a)(1), D.C. Official Code) is amended by
4 striking “the Secretary of Treasury” and all that
5 follows through “United States Secret Service Uni-
6 formed Division, and”.

7 (5) Subsection (k)(2)(B) of the Policemen and
8 Firemen’s Retirement and Disability Act (sec. 5–
9 716(b)(2), D.C. Official Code) is amended by insert-
10 ing “, or, for a member who was an officer or mem-
11 ber of the United States Secret Service Uniformed
12 Division, or the United States Secret Service Divi-
13 sion, 40 percent of the corresponding salary for step
14 5 of the Officer rank in section 10203 of title 5,
15 United States Code” after “member’s death”.

16 (6) Section 1 of the Act entitled “An Act to
17 provide a 5-day week for officers and members of
18 the Metropolitan Police force, the United States
19 Park Police force, and the White House Police force,
