Mr. LIEBERMAN (for himself and Ms. COLLINS) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To extend the authority for relocation expenses test programs for Federal employees, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. RELOCATION EXPENSES TEST PROGRAMS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 5739 of title 5, United
5 States Code, is amended—

6 (1) in subsection (a), by striking paragraph (3);

7 (2) in subsection (b)—

8 (A) by inserting “or extended” after “ap-
9 proved”; and

1 (B) by inserting “or extension” after “of
2 the program”;

3 (3) by striking subsection (c) and inserting the
4 following:

5 “(c)(1) An agency authorized to conduct a test pro-
6 gram under subsection (a) shall annually submit a report
7 on the results of the program to date to the Administrator.

8 “(2) Not later than 3 months after completion of a
9 test program, the agency conducting the program shall
10 submit a final report on the results of the program to the
11 Administrator and the appropriate committees of Con-
12 gress.”;

13 (4) in subsection (d), by striking “10” and in-
14 serting “12”; and

15 (5) by striking subsection (e) and inserting the
16 following:

17 “(e)(1) The Administrator may not approve any test
18 program for an initial period of more than 4 years.

19 “(2)(A) Upon the request of the agency admin-
20 istering a test program, the Administrator may extend the
21 program.

22 “(B) An extension under subparagraph (A) may not
23 exceed 4 years.

1 “(C) The Administrator may exercise more than 1
2 extension under subparagraph (A) with respect to any test
3 program.”.

4 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall take effect
5 on October 31, 2009.

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
