A BILL

To increase criminal penalties for certain knowing violations relating to food that is misbranded or adulterated.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Food Safety Enforce-
- 5 ment Act of 2010".
- 6 SEC. 2. CRIMINAL PENALTIES.
- 7 Section 303(a) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cos-
- 8 metic Act (21 U.S.C. 333(a)) is amended—

1	(1) in paragraph (1), by striking "Any" and in-
2	serting "Except as provided in paragraph (2) or (3),
3	any'';
4	(2) in paragraph (2), by striking "Notwith-
5	standing the provisions of paragraph (1) of this sec-
6	tion, if" and inserting "If"; and
7	(3) by adding at the end the following:
8	"(3) Any person who knowingly violates subsection
9	(a), (b), (c), (k), or (v) of section 301 with respect to any
10	food that is misbranded or adulterated shall be fined
11	under title 18, United States Code, imprisoned for not
12	more than 10 years, or both.".
