A BILL

To limit reimbursement for excessive compensation of government contractors equal to the pay of Cabinet Secretaries.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Stop Excessive Tax-
5 payer Payments to Government Contractors Act of 2011”.

6 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON ALLOWABLE COMPENSATION**

7 **COSTS.**

8 (a) **LIMITATION.**—

1 (1) CIVILIAN CONTRACTS.—Section
2 4304(a)(16) of title 41, United States Code, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 “(16) Costs of compensation of contractor and
5 subcontractor employees for a fiscal year, regardless
6 of the contract funding source, to the extent that
7 such compensation exceeds the rate payable for level
8 I of the Executive Schedule under section 5312 of
9 title 5.”.

10 (2) DEFENSE CONTRACTS.—Section
11 2324(e)(1)(P) of title 10, United States Code, is
12 amended to read as follows:

13 “(P) Costs of compensation of contractor and
14 subcontractor employees for a fiscal year, regardless
15 of the contract funding source, to the extent that
16 such compensation exceeds the rate payable for level
17 I of the Executive Schedule under section 5312 of
18 title 5.”.

19 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

20 (1) IN GENERAL.—Section 1127 of title 41,
21 United States Code, is hereby repealed.

22 (2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-
23 tions at the beginning of chapter 11 of title 41,

- 1 United States Code, is amended by striking the item
- 2 relating to section 1127.
