AN ACT

To correct and simplify the drafting of section 1752 (relating to restricted buildings or grounds) of title 18, United States Code.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “~~Federal Restricted~~
5 ~~Buildings and Grounds Improvement Act of 2011~~”.

6 **SEC. 2. RESTRICTED BUILDING OR GROUNDS.**

7 Section 1752 of title 18, United States Code, is
8 amended to read as follows:

1 **“§ 1752. Restricted building or grounds**

2 “(a) Whoever—

3 “(1) knowingly enters or remains in any re-
4 stricted building or grounds without lawful authority
5 to do so;

6 “(2) knowingly, and with intent to impede or
7 disrupt the orderly conduct of Government business
8 or official functions, engages in disorderly or disrupt-
9 tive conduct in, or within such proximity to, any re-
10 stricted building or grounds when, or so that, such
11 conduct, in fact, impedes or disrupts the orderly con-
12 duct of Government business or official functions;

13 “(3) knowingly, and with the intent to impede
14 or disrupt the orderly conduct of Government busi-
15 ness or official functions, obstructs or impedes in-
16 gress or egress to or from any restricted building or
17 grounds; or

18 “(4) knowingly engages in any act of physical
19 violence against any person or property in any re-
20 stricted building or grounds;

21 or attempts or conspires to do so, shall be punished as
22 provided in subsection (b).

23 “(b) The punishment for a violation of subsection (a)
24 is—

25 “(1) a fine under this title or imprisonment for
26 not more than 10 years, or both, if—

1 ~~“(A) any person, during and in relation to~~
2 ~~the offense, uses or carries a deadly or dan-~~
3 ~~gerous weapon or firearm; or~~

4 ~~“(B) the offense results in significant bod-~~
5 ~~ily injury as defined by section 2118(e)(3); and~~

6 ~~“(2) a fine under this title or imprisonment for~~
7 ~~not more than one year, or both, in any other case.~~

8 ~~“(e) In this section—~~

9 ~~“(1) the term ‘restricted buildings or grounds’~~
10 ~~means any posted, cordoned off, or otherwise re-~~
11 ~~stricted area—~~

12 ~~“(A) of the White House or its grounds, or~~
13 ~~the Vice President’s official residence or its~~
14 ~~grounds;~~

15 ~~“(B) of a building or grounds where the~~
16 ~~President or other person protected by the Se-~~
17 ~~cret Service is or will be temporarily visiting; or~~

18 ~~“(C) of a building or grounds so restricted~~
19 ~~in conjunction with an event designated as a~~
20 ~~special event of national significance; and~~

21 ~~“(2) the term ‘other person protected by the~~
22 ~~Secret Service’ means any person whom the United~~
23 ~~States Secret Service is authorized to protect under~~
24 ~~section 3056 of this title when such person has not~~
25 ~~declined such protection.”.~~

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 *This Act may be cited as the “Federal Restricted*
3 *Buildings and Grounds Improvement Act of 2011”.*

4 **SEC. 2. RESTRICTED BUILDING OR GROUNDS.**

5 *Section 1752 of title 18, United States Code, is amend-*
6 *ed to read as follows:*

7 **“§ 1752. Restricted building or grounds**

8 *“(a) Whoever—*

9 *“(1) knowingly enters or remains in any re-*
10 *stricted building or grounds without lawful authority*
11 *to do so;*

12 *“(2) knowingly, and with intent to impede or*
13 *disrupt the orderly conduct of Government business or*
14 *official functions, engages in disorderly or disruptive*
15 *conduct in, or within such proximity to, any re-*
16 *stricted building or grounds when, or so that, such*
17 *conduct, in fact, impedes or disrupts the orderly con-*
18 *duct of Government business or official functions;*

19 *“(3) knowingly, and with the intent to impede or*
20 *disrupt the orderly conduct of Government business or*
21 *official functions, obstructs or impedes ingress or*
22 *egress to or from any restricted building or grounds;*
23 *or*

24 *“(4) knowingly engages in any act of physical*
25 *violence against any person or property in any re-*
26 *stricted building or grounds;*

1 *or attempts or conspires to do so, shall be punished as pro-*
2 *vided in subsection (b).*

3 *“(b) The punishment for a violation of subsection (a)*
4 *is—*

5 *“(1) a fine under this title or imprisonment for*
6 *not more than 10 years, or both, if—*

7 *“(A) the person, during and in relation to*
8 *the offense, uses or carries a deadly or dangerous*
9 *weapon or firearm; or*

10 *“(B) the offense results in significant bodily*
11 *injury as defined by section 2118(e)(3); and*

12 *“(2) a fine under this title or imprisonment for*
13 *not more than one year, or both, in any other case.*

14 *“(c) In this section—*

15 *“(1) the term ‘restricted buildings or grounds’*
16 *means any posted, cordoned off, or otherwise re-*
17 *stricted area—*

18 *“(A) of the White House or its grounds, or*
19 *the Vice President’s official residence or its*
20 *grounds;*

21 *“(B) of a building or grounds where the*
22 *President or other person protected by the Secret*
23 *Service is or will be temporarily visiting; or*

1 “(C) of a building or grounds so restricted
2 in conjunction with an event designated as a
3 special event of national significance; and

4 “(2) the term ‘other person protected by the Se-
5 cret Service’ means any person whom the United
6 States Secret Service is authorized to protect under
7 section 3056 of this title or by Presidential memo-
8 randum, when such person has not declined such pro-
9 tection.”.
