# H. R. 3672

Making appropriations for disaster relief requirements for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, and for other purposes.

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## IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

DECEMBER 14, 2011

Mr. ROGERS of Kentucky introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Appropriations, and in addition to the Committee on the Budget, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

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## A BILL

Making appropriations for disaster relief requirements for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That the following sums are appropriated, out of any  
4       money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the  
5       fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, and for other pur-  
6       poses, namely:

1 TITLE I—DISASTER RELIEF  
2 DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY  
3 FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY  
4 DISASTER RELIEF FUND

5 For an additional amount for the “Disaster Relief  
6 Fund” for major disasters declared pursuant to the Rob-  
7 ert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance  
8 Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.), \$6,400,000,000, to remain  
9 available until expended: *Provided*, That such amount is  
10 designated by the Congress as being for disaster relief pur-  
11 suant to section 251(b)(2)(D) of the Balanced Budget and  
12 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985.

13 DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE—CIVIL  
14 DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY  
15 CORPS OF ENGINEERS—CIVIL  
16 MISSISSIPPI RIVER AND TRIBUTARIES

17 For an additional amount for “Mississippi River and  
18 Tributaries” for necessary expenses for repair of damages  
19 to Federal projects resulting from a major disaster de-  
20 clared pursuant to the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief  
21 and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et. seq.),  
22 \$802,000,000, to remain available until expended: *Pro-*  
23 *vided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress  
24 as being for disaster relief pursuant to section  
25 251(b)(2)(D) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency

1 Deficit Control Act of 1985: *Provided further*, That the  
2 Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works shall sub-  
3 mit to the Committees on Appropriations of the House  
4 of Representatives and the Senate a monthly report detail-  
5 ing the allocation and obligation of these funds, beginning  
6 not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment  
7 of this Act.

8 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

9 For an additional amount for “Operation and Main-  
10 tenance” for necessary expenses to dredge navigation  
11 channels in response to, and repair damage to Corps  
12 projects resulting from, a major disaster declared pursu-  
13 ant to the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emer-  
14 gency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et. seq.),  
15 \$534,000,000, to remain available until expended: *Pro-*  
16 *vided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress  
17 as being for disaster relief pursuant to section  
18 251(b)(2)(D) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency  
19 Deficit Control Act of 1985: *Provided further*, That the  
20 Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works shall sub-  
21 mit to the Committees on Appropriations of the House  
22 of Representatives and the Senate a monthly report detail-  
23 ing the allocation and obligation of these funds, beginning  
24 not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment  
25 of this Act.

## 1 FLOOD CONTROL AND COASTAL EMERGENCIES

2 For an additional amount for “Flood Control and  
3 Coastal Emergencies”, as authorized by section 5 of the  
4 Act of August 18, 1941 (33 U.S.C. 701n), for necessary  
5 expenses to prepare for flood, hurricane, and other natural  
6 disasters and support emergency operations, repair, and  
7 other activities as authorized by law, in response to a  
8 major disaster declared pursuant to the Robert T. Staf-  
9 ford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42  
10 U.S.C. 5121 et. seq.), \$388,000,000, to remain available  
11 until expended: *Provided*, That such amount is designated  
12 by the Congress as being for disaster relief pursuant to  
13 section 251(b)(2)(D) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-  
14 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985: *Provided further*, That  
15 the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works shall  
16 submit to the Committees on Appropriations of the House  
17 of Representatives and the Senate a monthly report detail-  
18 ing the allocation and obligation of these funds, beginning  
19 not later than 60 days after the date of the enactment  
20 of this Act.

1 TITLE II—COMBATING WASTE, FRAUD, AND  
2 ABUSE

3 SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION

4 LIMITATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

5 For an additional amount for continuing disability re-  
6 views under titles II and XVI of the Social Security Act  
7 and for the cost associated with conducting redetermina-  
8 tions of eligibility under title XVI of the Social Security  
9 Act, not more than \$483,484,000 may be expended, as  
10 authorized by section 201(g)(1) of the Social Security Act,  
11 from any one or all of the trust funds referred to therein:  
12 *Provided*, That such amount is additional new budget au-  
13 thority specified for purposes of subsection 251(b)(2)(B)  
14 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control  
15 Act of 1985, and shall be treated for such purposes as  
16 being included under this heading in the Departments of  
17 Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and  
18 Related Agencies Appropriations Act, or any continuing  
19 appropriation Act, for fiscal year 2012.

20 TITLE III—GENERAL PROVISION

21 SEC. 301. Each amount appropriated or made avail-  
22 able in this Act is in addition to amounts otherwise appro-  
23 priated for the fiscal year involved.

1        This Act may be cited as the “Disaster Relief Appro-  
2    priations Act, 2012”.

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
