Mr. REED, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1231) to amend the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act to require that each 5-year offshore oil and gas leasing program offer leasing in the areas with the most prospective oil and gas resources, to establish a domestic oil and natural gas production goal, and for other purposes.

- 1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
- 3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 1231) to amend the Outer Conti-
3 nental Shelf Lands Act to require that each 5-year off-
4 shore oil and gas leasing program offer leasing in the
5 areas with the most prospective oil and gas resources, to
6 establish a domestic oil and natural gas production goal,
7 and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall
8 be dispensed with. All points of order against consider-
9 ation of the bill are waived. General debate shall be con-
10 fined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally di-
11 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
12 member of the Committee on Natural Resources. After
13 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
14 under the five-minute rule. The amendment recommended
15 by the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in
16 the bill shall be considered as adopted in the House and
17 in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as amended, shall
18 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-
19 sions in the bill, as amended, are waived. No further
20 amendment to the bill, as amended, shall be in order ex-
21 cept those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules
22 accompanying this resolution. Each further amendment
23 may be offered only in the order printed in the report,
24 may be offered only by a Member designated in the report,
25 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time

1 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by
2 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to
3 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-
4 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee
5 of the Whole. All points of order against such further
6 amendments are waived. At the conclusion of consider-
7 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
8 and report the bill, as amended, to the House with such
9 further amendments as may have been adopted. The pre-
10 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill
11 and amendments thereto to final passage without inter-
12 vening motion except one motion to recommit with or
13 without instructions.

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
