RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2681) to provide additional time for the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to issue achievable standards for cement manufacturing facilities, and for other purposes, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2250) to provide additional time for the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to issue achievable standards for industrial, commercial, and institu-

tional boilers, process heaters, and incinerators, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the State of the Union for consid-
5 eration of the bill (H.R. 2681) to provide additional time
6 for the Administrator of the Environmental Protection
7 Agency to issue achievable standards for cement manufac-
8 turing facilities, and for other purposes. The first reading
9 of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order
10 against consideration of the bill are waived. General de-
11 bate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one
12 hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and rank-
13 ing minority member of the Committee on Energy and
14 Commerce. After general debate the bill shall be consid-
15 ered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall
16 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose
17 of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment
18 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Com-
19 mittee on Energy and Commerce now printed in the bill.
20 The committee amendment in the nature of a substitute
21 shall be considered as read. All points of order against
22 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute
23 are waived. No amendment to the committee amendment
24 in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those

1 received for printing in the portion of the Congressional
2 Record designated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule
3 XVIII in a daily issue dated October 4, 2011, or earlier
4 and except pro forma amendments for the purpose of de-
5 bate. Each amendment so received may be offered only
6 by the Member who caused it to be printed or a designee
7 and shall be considered as read if printed. At the conclu-
8 sion of consideration of the bill for amendment the Com-
9 mittee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
10 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
11 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
12 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
13 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
14 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
15 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without
16 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
17 or without instructions.

18 SEC. 2. At any time after the adoption of this resolu-
19 tion the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule
20 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of
21 the Whole House on the State of the Union for consider-
22 ation of the bill (H.R. 2250) to provide additional time
23 for the Administrator of the Environmental Protection
24 Agency to issue achievable standards for industrial, com-
25 mercial, and institutional boilers, process heaters, and in-

1 cinerators, and for other purposes. The first reading of
2 the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against
3 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall
4 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-
5 ly divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minor-
6 ity member of the Committee on Energy and Commerce.
7 After general debate the bill shall be considered for
8 amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order
9 to consider as an original bill for the purpose of amend-
10 ment under the five-minute rule the amendment in the na-
11 ture of a substitute recommended by the Committee on
12 Energy and Commerce now printed in the bill. The com-
13 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be
14 considered as read. All points of order against the com-
15 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute are
16 waived. No amendment to the committee amendment in
17 the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those
18 received for printing in the portion of the Congressional
19 Record designated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule
20 XVIII in a daily issue dated October 4, 2011, or earlier
21 and except pro forma amendments for the purpose of de-
22 bate. Each amendment so received may be offered only
23 by the Member who caused it to be printed or a designee
24 and shall be considered as read if printed. At the conclu-
25 sion of consideration of the bill for amendment the Com-

1 mittee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
2 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
3 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
4 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
5 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
6 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
7 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without
8 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
9 or without instructions.
