Mr. WOODALL, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3521) to amend the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 to provide for a legislative line-item veto to expedite consideration of rescissions, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3521) to amend the Congressional

1 Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 to provide
2 for a legislative line-item veto to expedite consideration of
3 rescissions, and for other purposes. The first reading of
4 the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against
5 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall
6 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-
7 ly divided among and controlled by the chair and ranking
8 minority member of the Committee on the Budget and
9 Representative Simpson of Idaho or his designee. After
10 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
11 under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the amendments rec-
12 ommended by the Committees on the Budget and Rules
13 now printed in the bill, it shall be in order to consider
14 as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under
15 the five-minute rule an amendment in the nature of a sub-
16 stitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print
17 112-12. That amendment in the nature of a substitute
18 shall be considered as read. All points of order against
19 that amendment in the nature of a substitute are waived.
20 No amendment to that amendment in the nature of a sub-
21 stitute shall be in order except those printed in the report
22 of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution.
23 Each such amendment may be offered only in the order
24 printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member
25 designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall

1 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
2 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
3 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-
4 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House
5 or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order
6 against such amendments are waived. At the conclusion
7 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
8 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
9 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
10 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
11 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
12 the amendment in the nature of a substitute made in order
13 as original text. The previous question shall be considered
14 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final
15 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
16 recommit with or without instructions.

17 SEC. 2. It shall be in order at any time on the legisla-
18 tive day of February 9, 2012, for the Speaker to entertain
19 motions that the House suspend the rules, as though
20 under clause 1(e) of rule XV, relating to a measure ad-
21 dressing securities trading based on nonpublic informa-
22 tion.

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
