CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL**
 2 **GROUNDS FOR D.C. SPECIAL OLYMPICS LAW**
 3 **ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN.**

4 On October 3, 2014, or on such other date as the
 5 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Com-
 6 mittee on Rules and Administration of the Senate may
 7 jointly designate, the 29th annual District of Columbia
 8 Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run (in this
 9 resolution referred to as the “event”) may be run through
 10 the Capitol Grounds to carry the Special Olympics torch
 11 to honor local Special Olympics athletes.

12 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

13 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
 14 may be necessary to carry out the event.

15 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**
 16 **TIONS.**

17 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
 18 for physical preparations for the event.

19 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

20 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
 21 ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of
 22 title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-
 23 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,

- 1 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol
- 2 Grounds, in connection with the event.
