Ms. NORTON (for herself and Mr. BARLETTA) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the District of Columbia Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF THE CAPITOL**
4 **GROUNDS FOR DC SPECIAL OLYMPICS LAW**
5 **ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN.**

6 On September 27, 2013, or on such other date as
7 the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Com-
8 mittee on Rules and Administration of the Senate may
9 jointly designate, the 28th Annual District of Columbia
10 Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run (in this

1 resolution referred to as the “event”) may be run through
2 the Capitol Grounds to carry the Special Olympics torch
3 to honor local Special Olympics athletes.

4 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

5 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
6 may be necessary to carry out the event.

7 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**
8 **TIONS.**

9 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
10 for physical preparations for the event.

11 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

12 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
13 ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of
14 title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-
15 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,
16 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol
17 Grounds, in connection with the event.

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
