A BILL

To limit the amount of ammunition purchased or possessed by certain Federal agencies for a 6-month period.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ammunition Manage-
5 ment for More Obtainability Act of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON PURCHASING AMMUNITION.**

7 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

1 (1) the term “agency” has the meaning given
2 that term in section 551 of title 5, United States
3 Code;

4 (2) the term “ammunition” has the meaning
5 given that term in section 921 of title 18, United
6 States Code; and

7 (3) the term “covered agency”—

8 (A) means an agency; and

9 (B) does not include the Department of
10 Defense.

11 (b) PROHIBITION.—During the 6-month period be-
12 ginning on the date of enactment of this Act, a covered
13 agency may not purchase during any month or possess,
14 at any one time, more rounds of ammunition than the
15 monthly average of the number of rounds of ammunition
16 purchased by the covered agency during the period begin-
17 ning on January 1, 2001 and ending on December 31,
18 2009.

19 (c) GAO REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the
20 date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General
21 of the United States shall submit to Congress a report
22 regarding the purchasing of ammunition by agencies,
23 which shall include an assessment of the effect of the pur-

- 1 chasing of ammunition by agencies on the supply of am-
- 2 munition available to the public.

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
