A BILL

To delay the application of the employer health insurance
mandate, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Authority for Mandate
5 Delay Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. DELAY IN APPLICATION OF EMPLOYER HEALTH IN-**
2 **SURANCE MANDATE.**

3 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 1513(d) of the Patient
4 Protection and Affordable Care Act is amended by strik-
5 ing “December 31, 2013” and inserting “December 31,
6 2014”.

7 (b) **REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.**—

8 (1) **REPORTING BY EMPLOYERS.**—Section
9 1514(d) of the Patient Protection and Affordable
10 Care Act is amended by striking “December 31,
11 2013” and inserting “December 31, 2014”.

12 (2) **REPORTING BY INSURANCE PROVIDERS.**—
13 Section 1502(e) of the Patient Protection and Af-
14 fordable Care Act is amended by striking “2013”
15 and inserting “2014”.

16 (c) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by
17 this section shall take effect as if included in the provision
18 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act to
19 which they relate.

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
