A BILL

To repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and health care-related provisions in the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010.

1 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF PPACA AND HEALTH CARE-RE-**
2 **LATED PROVISIONS IN THE HEALTH CARE**
3 **AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT OF**
4 **2010.**

5 (a) PPACA.—Effective as of the enactment of the
6 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public Law
7 111–148), such Act (other than subsection (d) of section
8 1899A of the Social Security Act, as added and amended
9 by sections 3403 and 10320 of such Act) is repealed, and
10 the provisions of law amended or repealed by such Act
11 (other than such subsection (d)) are restored or revived
12 as if such Act had not been enacted.

13 (b) HEALTH CARE-RELATED PROVISIONS IN THE
14 HEALTH CARE AND EDUCATION RECONCILIATION ACT OF
15 2010.—Effective as of the enactment of the Health Care
16 and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Public Law
17 111–152), title I and subtitle B of title II of such Act
18 are repealed, and the provisions of law amended or re-
19 pealed by such title or subtitle, respectively, are restored
20 or revived as if such title and subtitle had not been en-
21 acted.

22 **SEC. 2. BUDGETARY EFFECTS OF THIS ACT.**

23 The budgetary effects of this Act, for the purpose of
24 complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010,
25 shall be determined by reference to the latest statement
26 titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation” for this

1 Act, submitted for printing in the Congressional Record
2 by the Chairman of the Committee on the Budget of the
3 House of Representatives, as long as such statement has
4 been submitted prior to the vote on passage of this Act.
