# H. R. 5140

To amend part E of title IV of the Social Security Act to enable a State to be reimbursed for child welfare training expenditures made by a nonprofit educational institution in the State.

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## A BILL

To amend part E of title IV of the Social Security Act to enable a State to be reimbursed for child welfare training expenditures made by a nonprofit educational institution in the State.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Child Welfare Work-  
5       force Partnership Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. CHILD WELFARE TRAINING EXPENDITURES MADE**  
2 **BY NONPROFIT EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION**  
3 **DEEMED TO BE MADE BY STATE FOR PUR-**  
4 **POSES OF FEDERAL REIMBURSEMENT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 474 of the Social Security  
6 Act (42 U.S.C. 674) is amended by adding at the end the  
7 following:

8 “(h) CHILD WELFARE TRAINING EXPENDITURES  
9 MADE BY NONPROFIT EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION  
10 DEEMED TO BE MADE BY STATE.—For purposes of this  
11 section, an expenditure described in subparagraph (A) or  
12 (B) of subsection (a)(3) which is made by a public or pri-  
13 vate nonprofit educational institution and which would be  
14 an allowable expenditure if made by the State claiming  
15 reimbursement with respect to the expenditure, shall be  
16 considered to have been made by the State, except to the  
17 extent that Federal funds have been paid with respect to  
18 the expenditure.”.

19 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by  
20 subsection (a) shall take effect on October 1, 2014, and  
21 shall apply to claims submitted on or after that date.

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
