# S. 983

To prohibit the Secretary of the Treasury from enforcing the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010.

Mr. CORNYN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

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## A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of the Treasury from enforcing the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Keep the IRS Off Your  
5 Health Care Act of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds the following:

1           (1) On May 10, 2013, the Internal Revenue  
2           Service admitted that it singled out advocacy groups,  
3           based on ideology, seeking tax-exempt status.

4           (2) This action raises pertinent questions about  
5           the agency's ability to implement and oversee the  
6           Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public  
7           Law 111–148) and the Health Care and Education  
8           Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–152).

9           (3) This action could be an indication of future  
10          Internal Revenue Service abuses in relation to the  
11          Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and the  
12          Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of  
13          2010, given that it is their responsibility to enforce  
14          a key provision, the individual mandate.

15          (4) Americans accept the principle that pa-  
16          tients, families, and doctors should be making med-  
17          ical decisions, not the Federal Government.

18 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITING ENFORCEMENT OF PPACA AND**  
19 **HCERA.**

20          The Secretary of the Treasury, or any delegate of the  
21          Secretary, shall not implement or enforce any provisions  
22          of or amendments made by the Patient Protection and Af-  
23          fordable Care Act (Public Law 111–148) or the Health
