3 resolution referred to as the “event”) may be run through
4 the Capitol Grounds to carry the Special Olympics torch
5 to honor local Special Olympics athletes.

6 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

7 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
8 may be necessary to carry out the event.

9 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**
10 **TIONS.**

11 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
12 for physical preparations for the event.

13 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

14 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
15 ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of
16 title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-
17 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,
18 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol
19 Grounds, in connection with the event.
