A BILL

To make technical corrections to the Homeland Security
Act of 2002.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “HSA Technical Correc-
5 tions Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REFERENCES TO THE HOMELAND SECURITY ACT**
7 **OF 2002.**

8 Except as otherwise expressly provided, whenever in
9 this Act an amendment or repeal is expressed in terms
10 of an amendment to, or a repeal of, a section or other
11 provision, the reference shall be considered to be made to
12 a section or other provision of the Homeland Security Act
13 of 2002 (Public Law 107–296; 6 U.S.C. 101 et seq.).

11 “(b) MATTER INCLUDED.—The report shall address
12 the following with respect to the period covered by the re-
13 port:

14 “(1) The aggregate number of all immigration
15 applications and petitions received, and processed,
16 by the Department.

17 “(2) Region-by-region statistics on the aggre-
18 gate number of immigration applications and peti-
19 tions filed by an alien (or filed on behalf of an alien)
20 and denied, disaggregated by category of denial and
21 application or petition type.

22 “(3) The quantity of backlogged immigration
23 applications and petitions that have been processed,
24 the aggregate number awaiting processing, and a de-
25 tailed plan for eliminating the backlog.

1 “(4) The average processing period for immi-
2 gration applications and petitions, disaggregated by
3 application or petition type.

4 “(5) The number and types of immigration-re-
5 lated grievances filed with any official of the Depart-
6 ment of Justice, and if those grievances were re-
7 solved.

8 “(6) Plans to address grievances and improve
9 immigration services.

10 “(7) Whether immigration-related fees were
11 used consistent with legal requirements regarding
12 such use.

13 “(8) Whether immigration-related questions
14 conveyed by customers to the Department (whether
15 conveyed in person, by telephone, or by means of the
16 Internet) were answered effectively and efficiently.”.

13 this section referred to as the “Rotation Program”) for
14 employees of the Department. The Rotation Program shall
15 use applicable best practices, including those from the
16 Chief Human Capital Officers Council.

17 “(b) GOALS.—The Rotation Program established by
18 the Secretary shall—

19 “(1) be established in accordance with the
20 Human Capital Strategic Plan of the Department;

21 “(2) provide middle and senior level employees
22 in the Department the opportunity to broaden their
23 knowledge through exposure to other components of
24 the Department;

1 “(3) expand the knowledge base of the Depart-
2 ment by providing for rotational assignments of em-
3 ployees to other components;

4 “(4) build professional relationships and con-
5 tacts among the employees in the Department;

6 “(5) invigorate the workforce with exciting and
7 professionally rewarding opportunities;

8 “(6) incorporate Department human capital
9 strategic plans and activities, and address critical
10 human capital deficiencies, recruitment and reten-
11 tion efforts, and succession planning within the Fed-
12 eral workforce of the Department; and

13 “(7) complement and incorporate (but not re-
14 place) rotational programs within the Department in
15 effect on the date of enactment of this section.

16 “(c) ADMINISTRATION.—

17 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Chief Human Capital
18 Officer shall administer the Rotation Program.

19 “(2) RESPONSIBILITIES.—The Chief Human
20 Capital Officer shall—

21 “(A) provide oversight of the establishment
22 and implementation of the Rotation Program;

23 “(B) establish a framework that supports
24 the goals of the Rotation Program and pro-

1 notes cross-disciplinary rotational opportuni-
2 ties;

3 “(C) establish eligibility for employees to
4 participate in the Rotation Program and select
5 participants from employees who apply;

6 “(D) establish incentives for employees to
7 participate in the Rotation Program, including
8 promotions and employment preferences;

9 “(E) ensure that the Rotation Program
10 provides professional education and training;

11 “(F) ensure that the Rotation Program de-
12 velops qualified employees and future leaders
13 with broadbased experience throughout the De-
14 partment;

15 “(G) provide for greater interaction among
16 employees in components of the Department;
17 and

18 “(H) coordinate with rotational programs
19 within the Department in effect on the date of
20 enactment of this section.

21 “(d) ALLOWANCES, PRIVILEGES, AND BENEFITS.—
22 All allowances, privileges, rights, seniority, and other bene-
23 fits of employees participating in the Rotation Program
24 shall be preserved.”.
