A BILL

To exclude striped bass from the anadromous fish doubling requirement in section 3406(b)(1) of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Save Our Salmon Act”*
5 *or the “SOS Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS.**

7 *Congress finds the following:*

8 (1) *California is home to many populations of*
9 *native salmon and steelhead.*

10 (2) *Many of the native salmon and steelhead*
11 *populations in California are listed under the Endan-*
12 *gered Species Act of 1973.*

13 (3) *The Central Valley Project Improvement Act*
14 *(CVPIA) required a doubling of natural production of*
15 *Central Valley populations of anadromous fish within*
16 *10 years.*

17 (4) *Striped bass are anadromous fish indigenous*
18 *to the East Coast of the United States and are not*
19 *native to the State of California.*

20 (5) *Striped bass were included in the CVPIA’s*
21 *fish doubling goal even though they are not a native*
22 *species.*

23 (6) *Striped bass prey on native salmon and*
24 *steelhead.*

1 (7) *Predation poses a serious threat to federally*
2 *protected juvenile salmon and other native fish in*
3 *California.*

4 (8) *According to the National Marine Fisheries*
5 *Service, reducing abundance of striped bass and other*
6 *non-native predators must be achieved to prevent ex-*
7 *inction of Central Valley salmon and steelhead or to*
8 *prevent the species from declining irreversibly.*

9 (9) *Therefore, the CVPIA’s fish-doubling goal for*
10 *two competing species is contradictory and counter-*
11 *productive for salmon and steelhead recovery.*

12 **SEC. 3. TREATMENT OF STRIPED BASS.**

13 (a) *ANADROMOUS FISH.*—*Section 3403(a) of the Cen-*
14 *tral Valley Project Improvement Act (title XXXIV of Public*
15 *Law 102–575) is amended by striking “striped bass,” after*
16 *“stocks of salmon (including steelhead),”.*

17 (b) *FISH AND WILDLIFE RESTORATION ACTIVITIES.*—
18 *Section 3406(b) of the Central Valley Project Improvement*
19 *Act (title XXXIV of Public Law 102–575) is amended by—*

20 (1) *striking paragraphs (14) and (18);*

21 (2) *redesignating paragraphs (15) through (17)*
22 *as paragraphs (14) through (16), respectively; and*

23 (3) *redesignating paragraphs (19) through (23)*
24 *as paragraphs (17) through (21), respectively.*

1 (c) *RESTORATION FUND ESTABLISHED.*—Section
2 *3407(a) of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act*
3 *(title XXXIV of Public Law 102–575) is amended by strik-*
4 *ing “(10)–(18), and (20)–(22)” and inserting “(10)–(16),*
5 *and (18)–(20)”.*
