RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 644) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to permanently extend and expand the charitable deduction for contributions of food inventory, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 636) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to permanently extend increased expensing limitations, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.

1 644) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to per-
2 manently extend and expand the charitable deduction for
3 contributions of food inventory. All points of order against
4 consideration of the bill are waived. In lieu of the amend-
5 ment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the
6 Committee on Ways and Means now printed in the bill,
7 an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of
8 the text of Rules Committee Print 114-5 shall be consid-
9 ered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered
10 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill,
11 as amended, are waived. The previous question shall be
12 considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any
13 further amendment thereto to final passage without inter-
14 vening motion except: (1) 90 minutes of debate equally
15 divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
16 member of the Committee on Ways and Means; and (2)
17 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

18 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
19 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 636) to
20 amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to permanently
21 extend increased expensing limitations, and for other pur-
22 poses. All points of order against consideration of the bill
23 are waived. In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a
24 substitute recommended by the Committee on Ways and
25 Means now printed in the bill, an amendment in the na-

1 ture of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Com-
2 mittee Print 114-6 shall be considered as adopted. The
3 bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All points
4 of order against provisions in the bill, as amended, are
5 waived. The previous question shall be considered as or-
6 dered on the bill, as amended, and on any further amend-
7 ment thereto to final passage without intervening motion
8 except: (1) 90 minutes of debate equally divided and con-
9 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the
10 Committee on Ways and Means; and (2) one motion to
11 recommit with or without instructions.

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
