Mr. COLLINS of Georgia, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1560) to improve cybersecurity in the United States through enhanced sharing of information about cybersecurity threats, and for other purposes, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1731) to amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to enhance multi-directional sharing of information related to cybersecurity risks and strengthen privacy and civil liberties protections, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-
2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule
3 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of
4 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 1560) to improve cybersecurity in
6 the United States through enhanced sharing of informa-
7 tion about cybersecurity threats, and for other purposes.
8 The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All
9 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.
10 General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not
11 exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair
12 and ranking minority member of the Permanent Select
13 Committee on Intelligence. After general debate the bill
14 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute
15 rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill
16 for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule
17 the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended
18 by the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence now
19 printed in the bill. The committee amendment in the na-
20 ture of a substitute shall be considered as read. All points
21 of order against the committee amendment in the nature
22 of a substitute are waived. No amendment to the com-
23 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be
24 in order except those printed in part A of the report of
25 the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution.

1 Each such amendment may be offered only in the order
2 printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member
3 designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall
4 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
5 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
6 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-
7 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House
8 or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order
9 against such amendments are waived. At the conclusion
10 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
11 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
12 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
13 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
14 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
15 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
16 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
17 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without
18 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
19 or without instructions.

20 SEC. 2. At any time after adoption of this resolution
21 the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII,
22 declare the House resolved into the Committee of the
23 Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration
24 of the bill (H.R. 1731) to amend the Homeland Security
25 Act of 2002 to enhance multi-directional sharing of infor-

1 mation related to cybersecurity risks and strengthen pri-
2 vacy and civil liberties protections, and for other purposes.
3 The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All
4 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.
5 General debate shall be confined to the bill and amend-
6 ments specified in this section and shall not exceed one
7 hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and rank-
8 ing minority member of the Committee on Homeland Se-
9 curity. After general debate the bill shall be considered
10 for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the
11 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by
12 the Committee on Homeland Security now printed in the
13 bill, it shall be in order to consider as an original bill for
14 the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule an
15 amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the
16 text of Rules Committee Print 114-12. That amendment
17 in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as read.
18 All points of order against that amendment in the nature
19 of a substitute are waived. No amendment to that amend-
20 ment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except
21 those printed in part B of the report of the Committee
22 on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each such amend-
23 ment may be offered only in the order printed in the re-
24 port, may be offered only by a Member designated in the
25 report, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for

1 the time specified in the report equally divided and con-
2 trolled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be
3 subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a de-
4 mand for division of the question in the House or in the
5 Committee of the Whole. All points of order against such
6 amendments are waived. At the conclusion of consider-
7 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
8 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
9 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a
10 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted
11 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the amend-
12 ment in the nature of a substitute made in order as origi-
13 nal text. The previous question shall be considered as or-
14 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
15 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
16 with or without instructions.

17 SEC. 3. (a) In the engrossment of H.R. 1560 the
18 Clerk shall—

19 (1) add the text of H.R. 1731, as passed by the
20 House, as new matter at the end of H.R. 1560;

21 (2) conform the title of H.R. 1560 to reflect the
22 addition of H.R. 1731, as passed by the House, to
23 the engrossment;

24 (3) assign appropriate designations to provi-
25 sions within the engrossment; and

1 (4) conform cross-references and provisions for
2 short titles within the engrossment.

3 (b) Upon the addition of the text of H.R. 1731, as
4 passed by the House, to the engrossment of H.R. 1560,
5 H.R. 1731 shall be laid on the table.

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
