A BILL

To amend the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act to include an act of unregulated custody transfer in the definition of child abuse and neglect, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Safe Home Act of
5 2018”.

1 **SEC. 2. TREATMENT OF UNREGULATED CUSTODY TRANS-**
2 **FER.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 3 of the Child Abuse Pre-
4 vention and Treatment Act (42 U.S.C. 5101 note) is
5 amended—

6 (1) in paragraph (2)—

7 (A) by striking “or an act or failure” and
8 inserting “an act or failure”; and

9 (B) by inserting “, or an unregulated cus-
10 tody transfer” after “serious harm”;

11 (2) in paragraph (7), by striking “; and” and
12 inserting a semicolon;

13 (3) in paragraph (8), by striking the period at
14 the end and inserting “; and”; and

15 (4) by adding at the end the following new
16 paragraph:

17 “(9) the term ‘unregulated custody transfer’
18 means the abandonment of a child, by the child’s
19 parent, legal guardian, or a person or entity acting
20 on behalf, and with the consent, of such parent or
21 guardian—

22 “(A) by placing a child with a person who
23 is not—

24 “(i) the child’s parent, step-parent,
25 grandparent, adult sibling, adult uncle or
26 aunt, legal guardian, or other relative;

1 “(ii) a friend of the family who is an
2 adult and with whom the child is familiar;

3 or

4 “(iii) a member of the federally recog-
5 nized Indian tribe of which the child is also
6 a member;

7 “(B) with the intent of severing the rela-
8 tionship between the child and the parent or
9 guardian of such child; and

10 “(C) without—

11 “(i) reasonably ensuring the safety of
12 the child and permanency of the placement
13 of the child, including by conducting an of-
14 ficial home study, background check, and
15 supervision; and

16 “(ii) transferring the legal rights and
17 responsibilities of parenthood or guardian-
18 ship under applicable Federal and State
19 law to a person described in subparagraph
20 (A).”.

21 (b) TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.—Paragraph (5) of
22 section 3 of the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment
23 Act (42 U.S.C. 5101 note) is amended by striking “450b”
24 and inserting “5304”.

1 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
2 this section shall take effect on the date that is 1 year
3 after the date of the enactment of this section.

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
